


Minnesota labor market is in good shape given population characteristics






2020 was the first year in which Minnesota counties with a natural decline outnumbered those with a natural increase






Net international migration generally make up for net domestic migration


Slower increase of younger workers and faster declines of older workers





Labor force slowly recovers but is still smaller than pre-pandemic


Minnesota, Seasonally Adjusted






Steady job growth post-pandemic

Minnesota, Seasonally Adjusted






Over-the-Year job growth ranks 37th in nation






Unemployment rate below national average






Minnesota has fewer workers per job vacancy than national average






Strong wage growth over the last year Over-the-Year Change, Minnesota and U.S.
