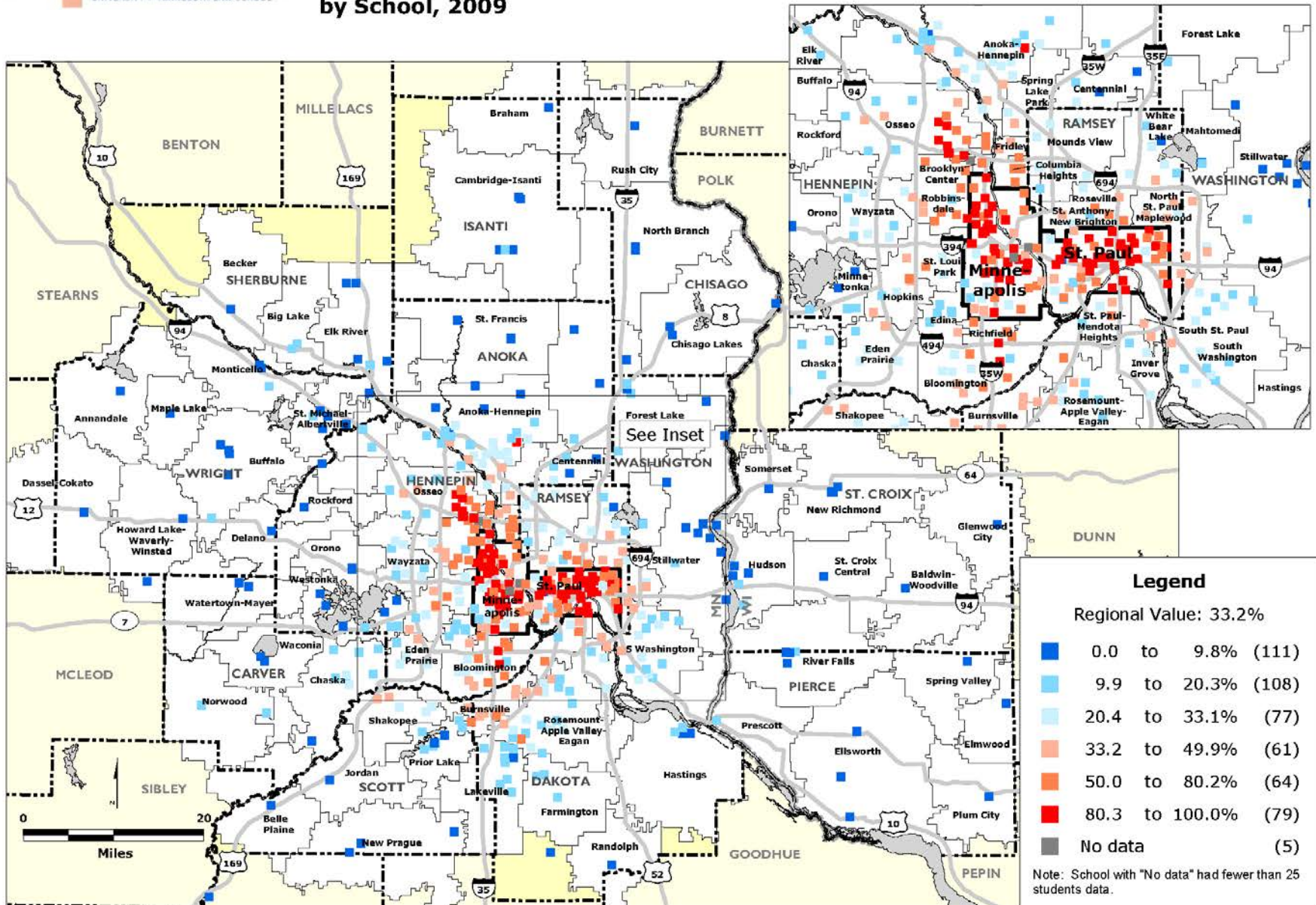


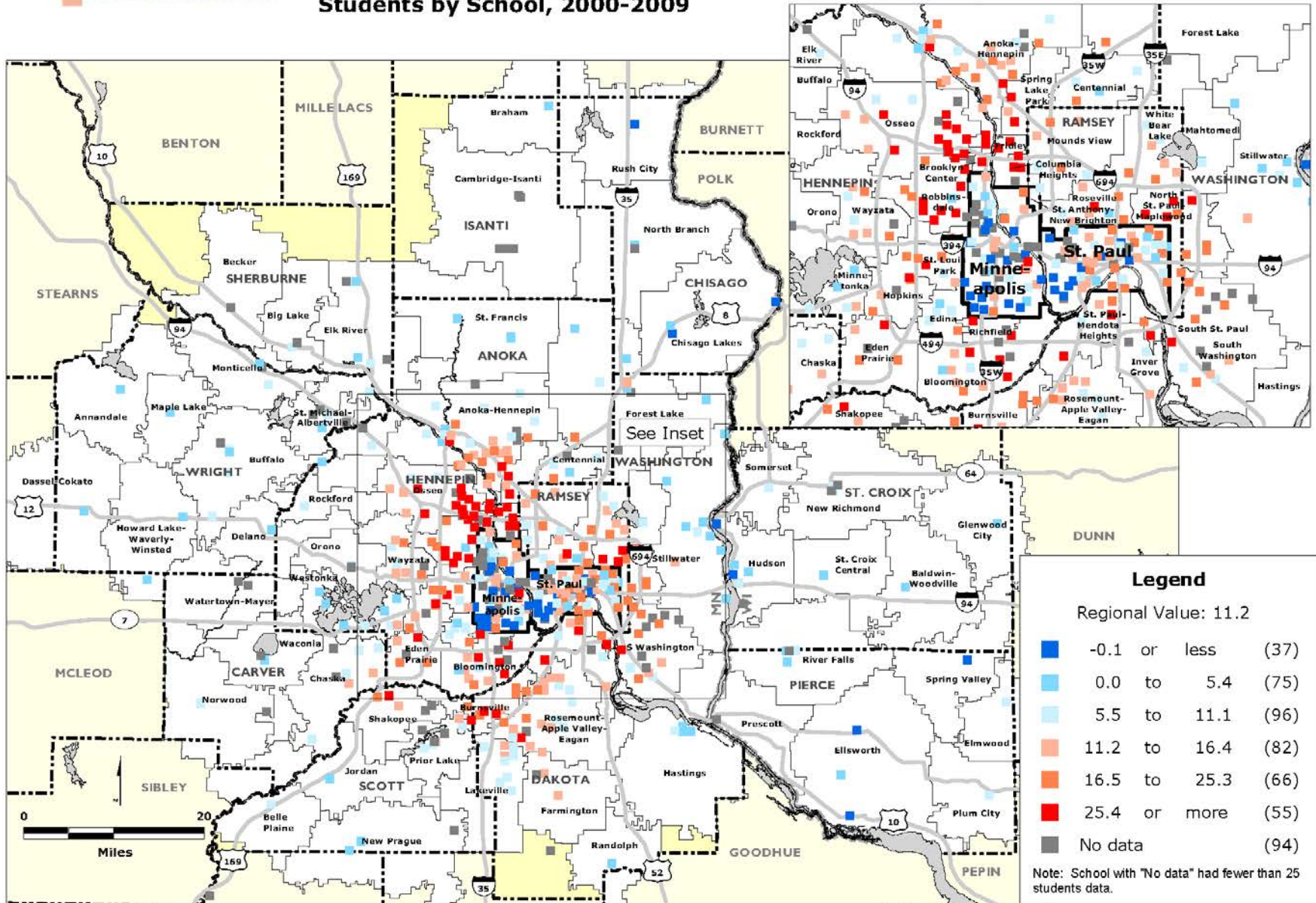

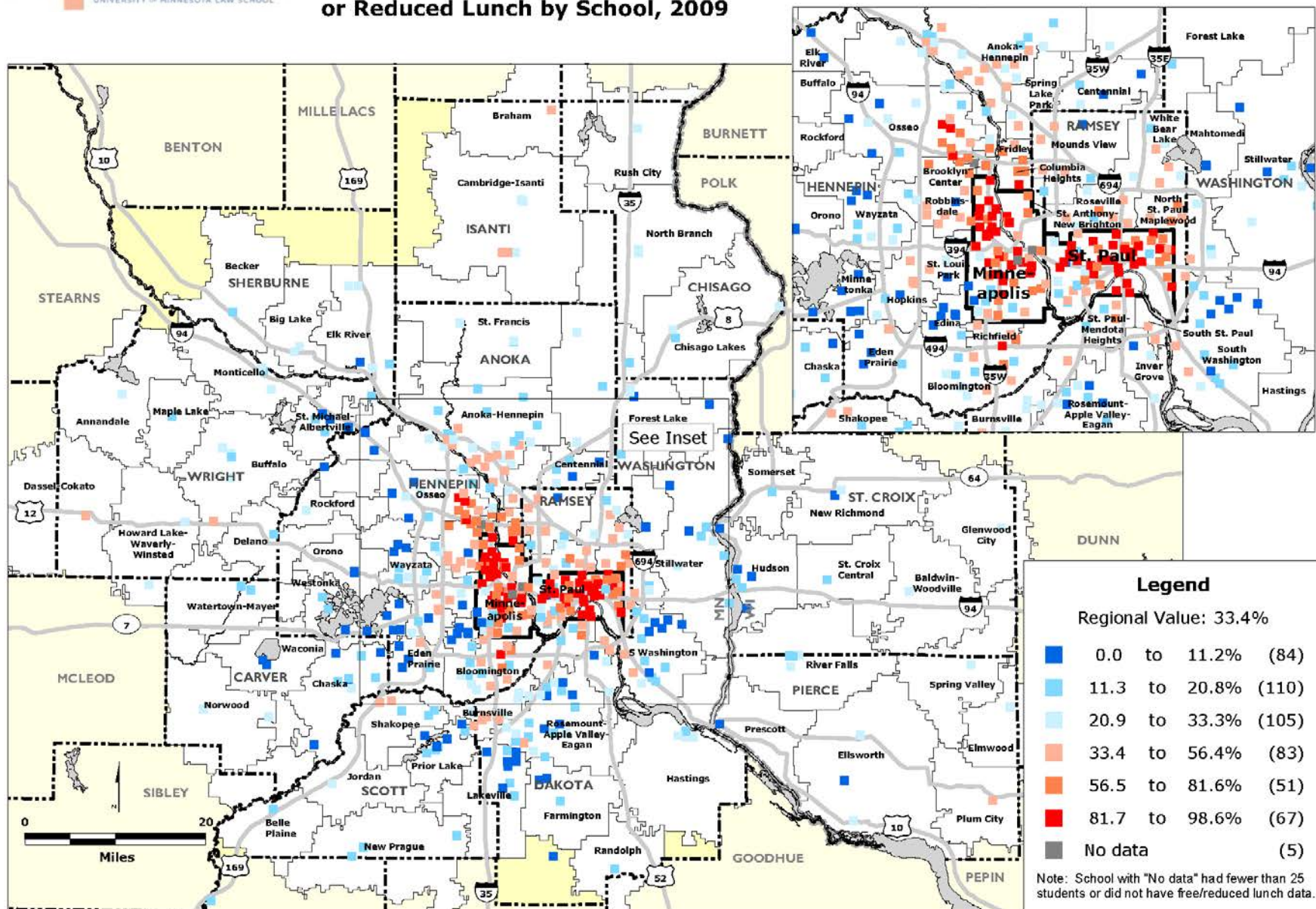
MINNEAPOLIS-SAINT PAUL REGION: Percentage Minority Elementary Students by School, 2009



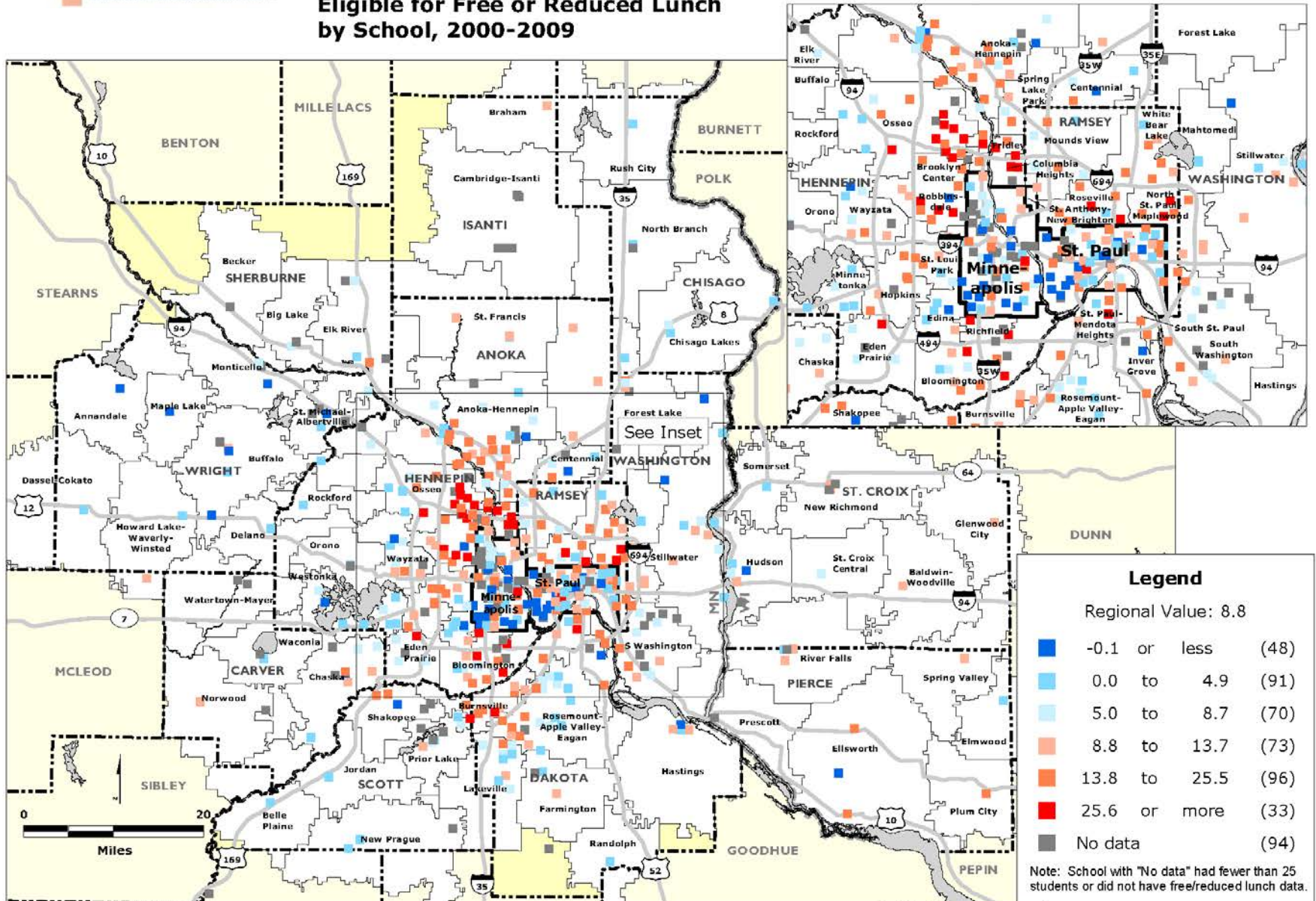
MINNEAPOLIS-SAINT PAUL REGION: Percentage Point Change in the Share of Minority Elementary Students by School, 2000-2009



MINNEAPOLIS-SAINT PAUL REGION: Percentage of Elementary Students Eligible for Free or Reduced Lunch by School, 2009



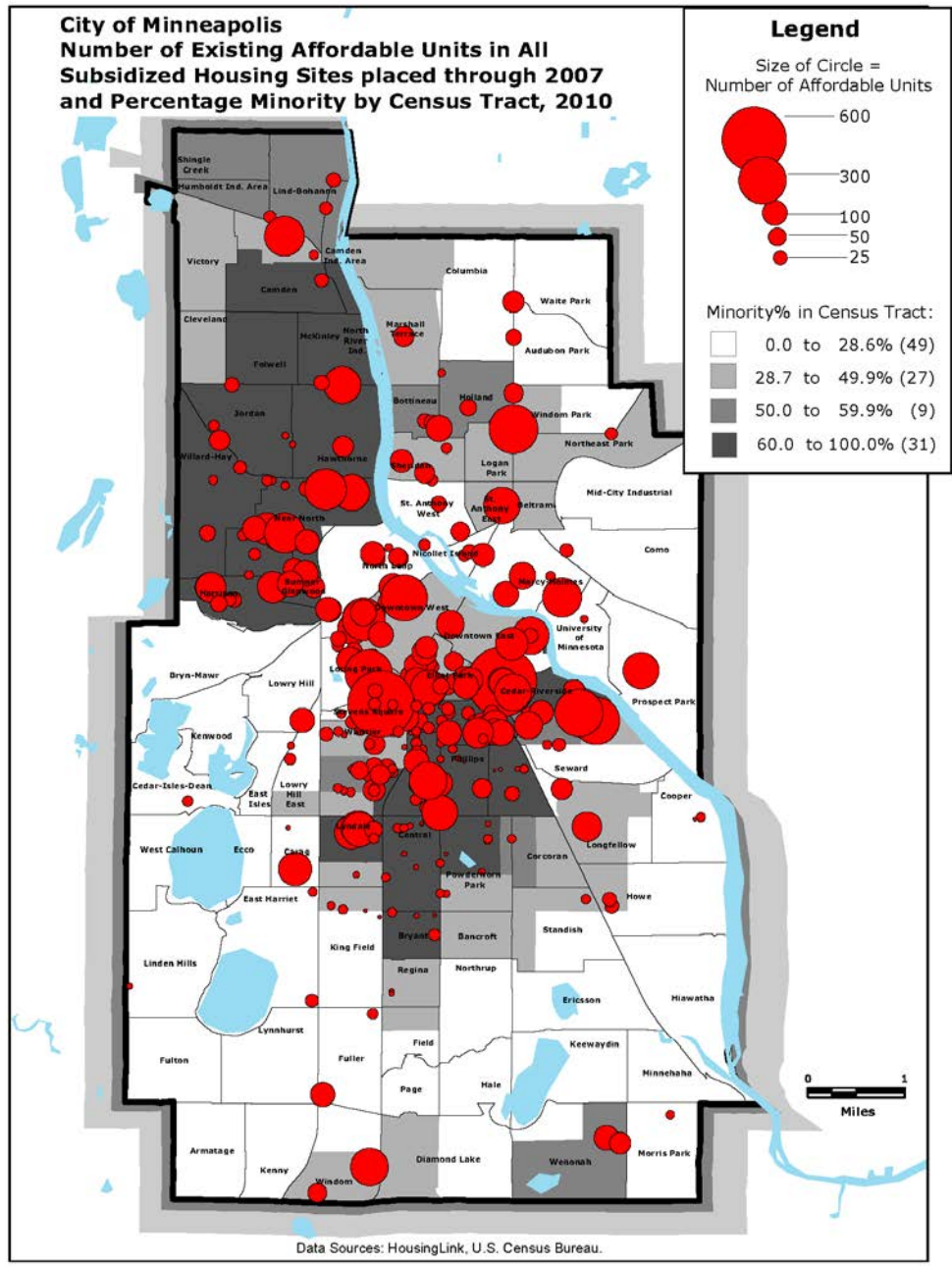

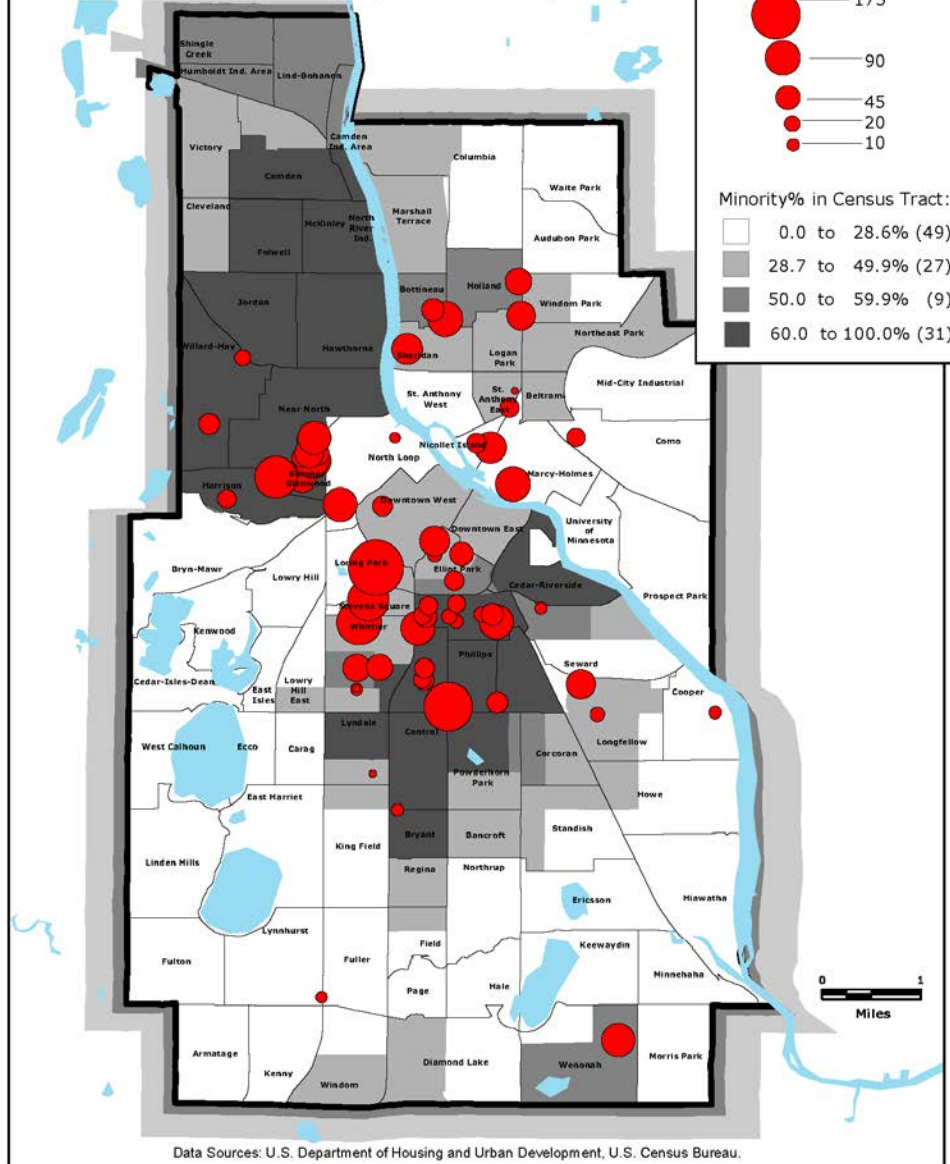

and Percentage Minority by Census Tract, 2010

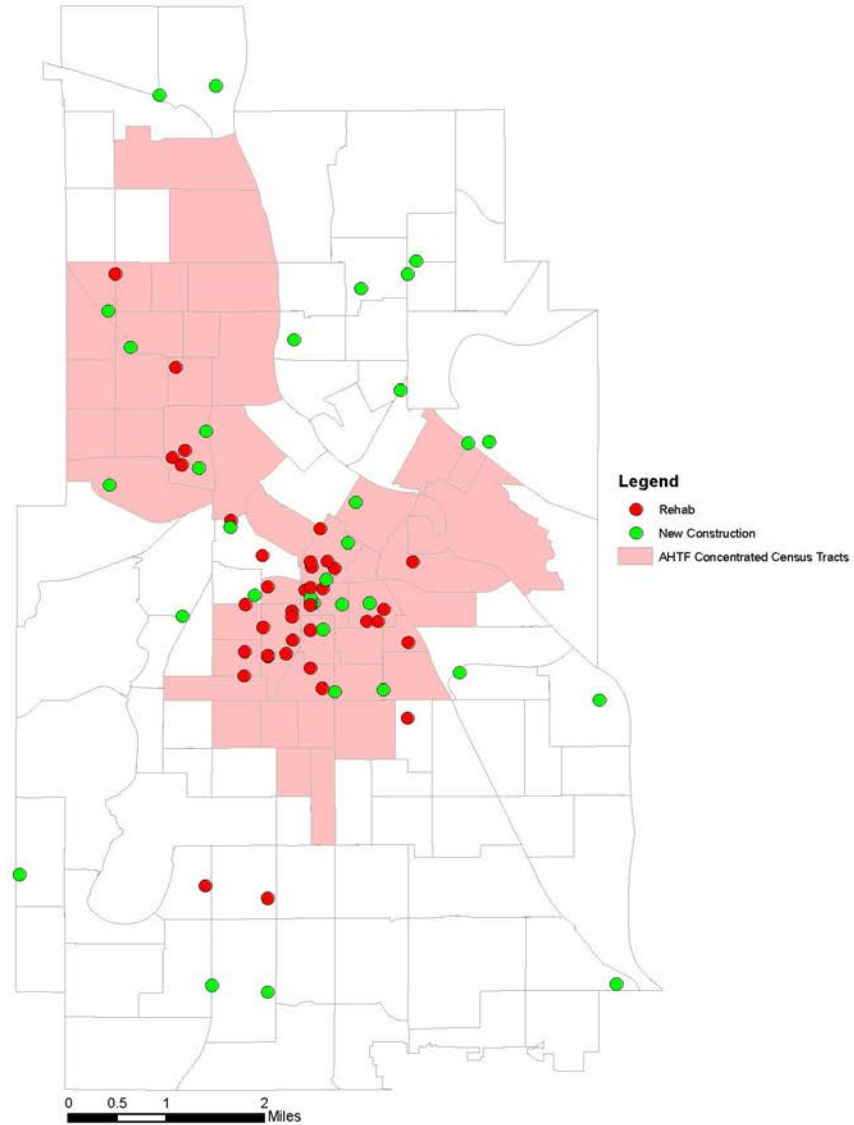

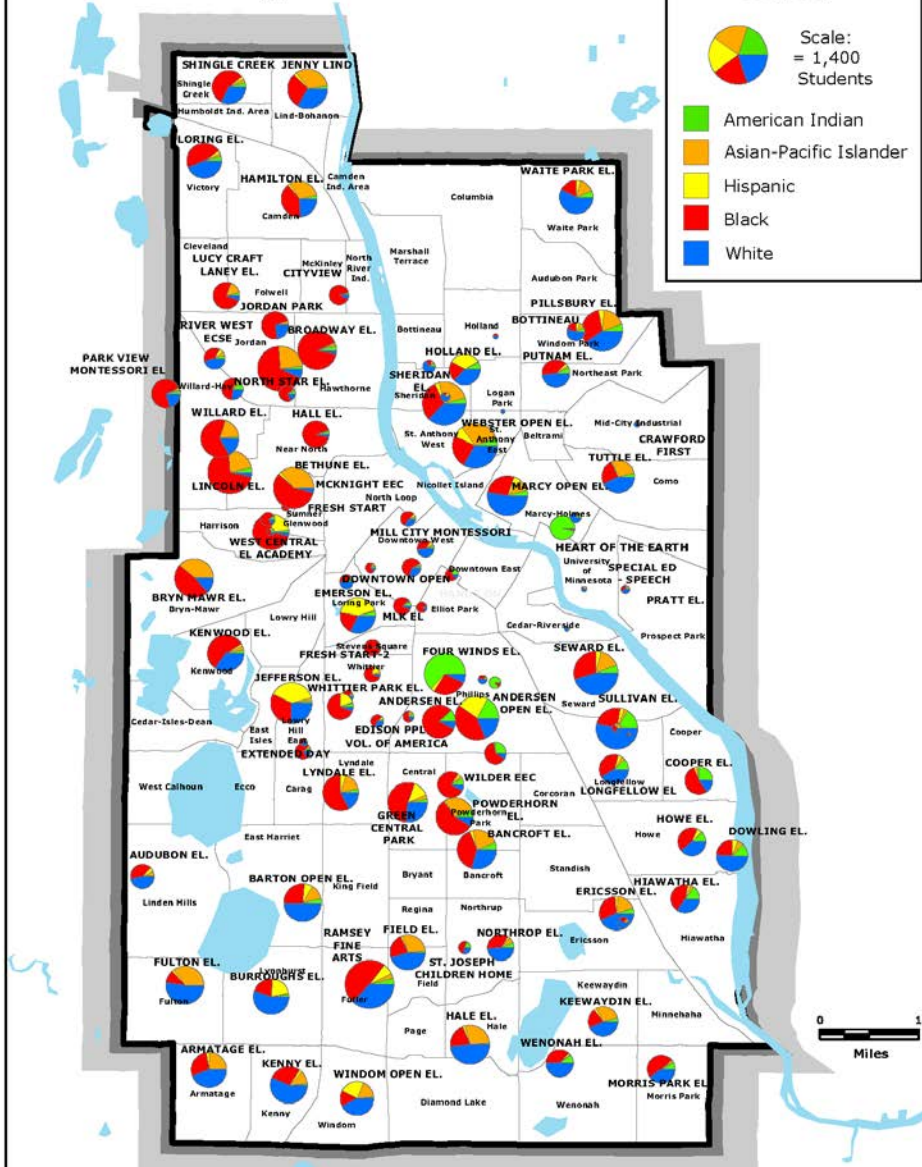

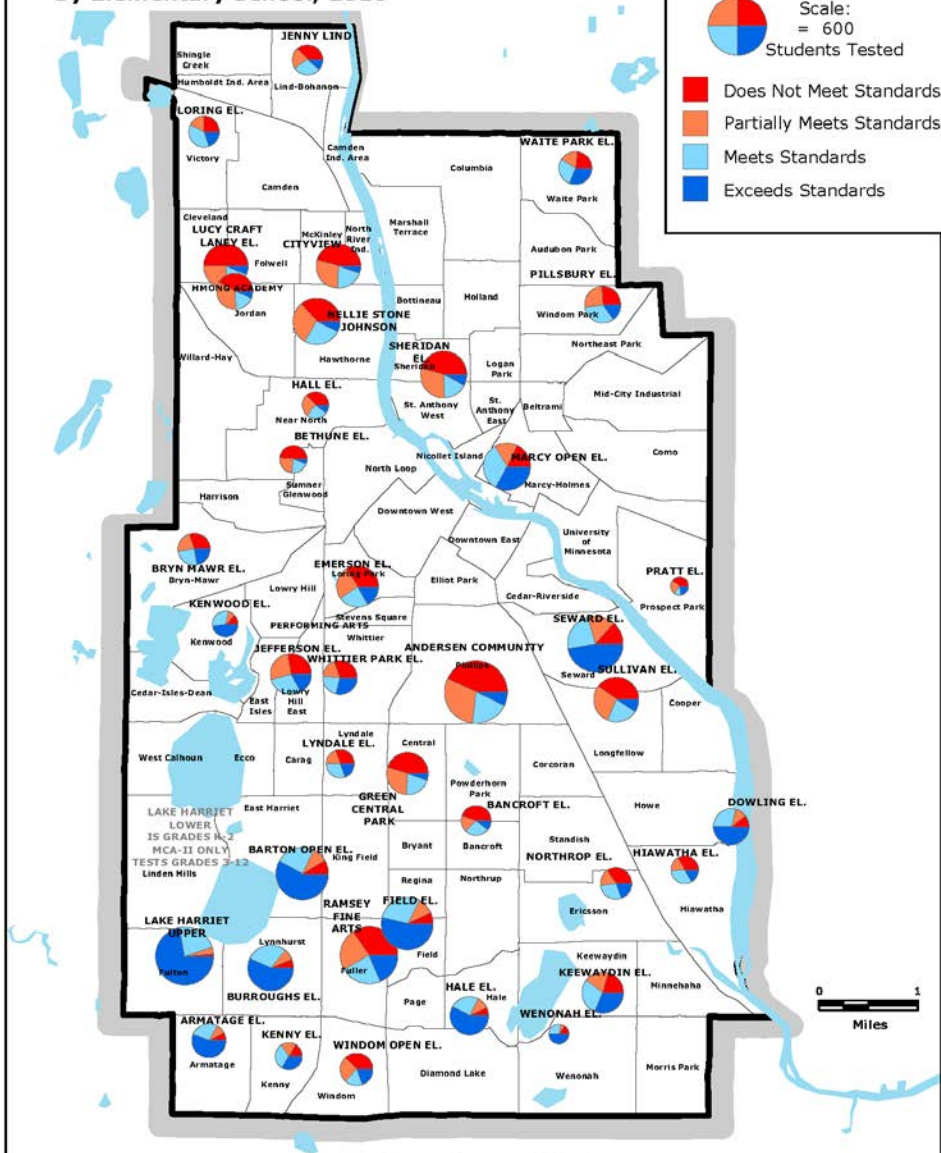

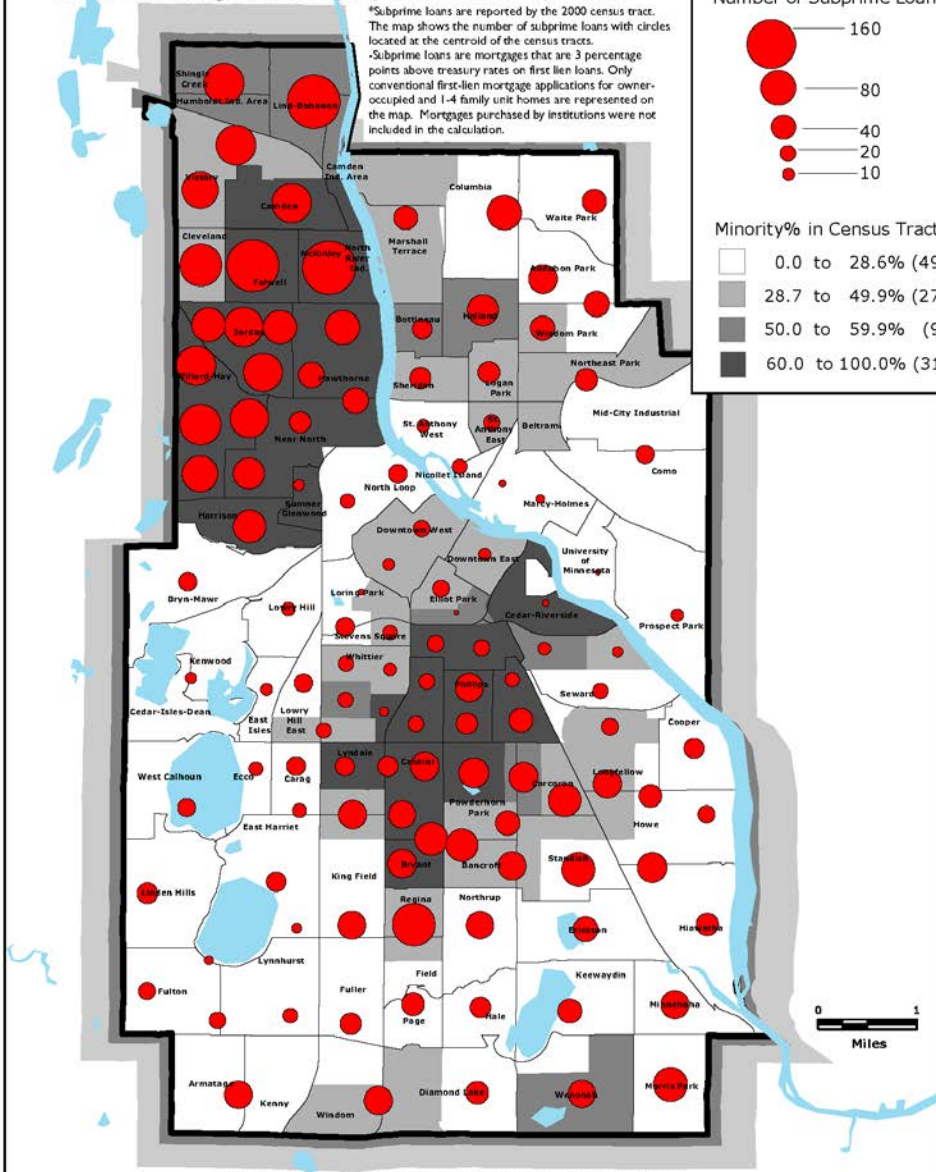

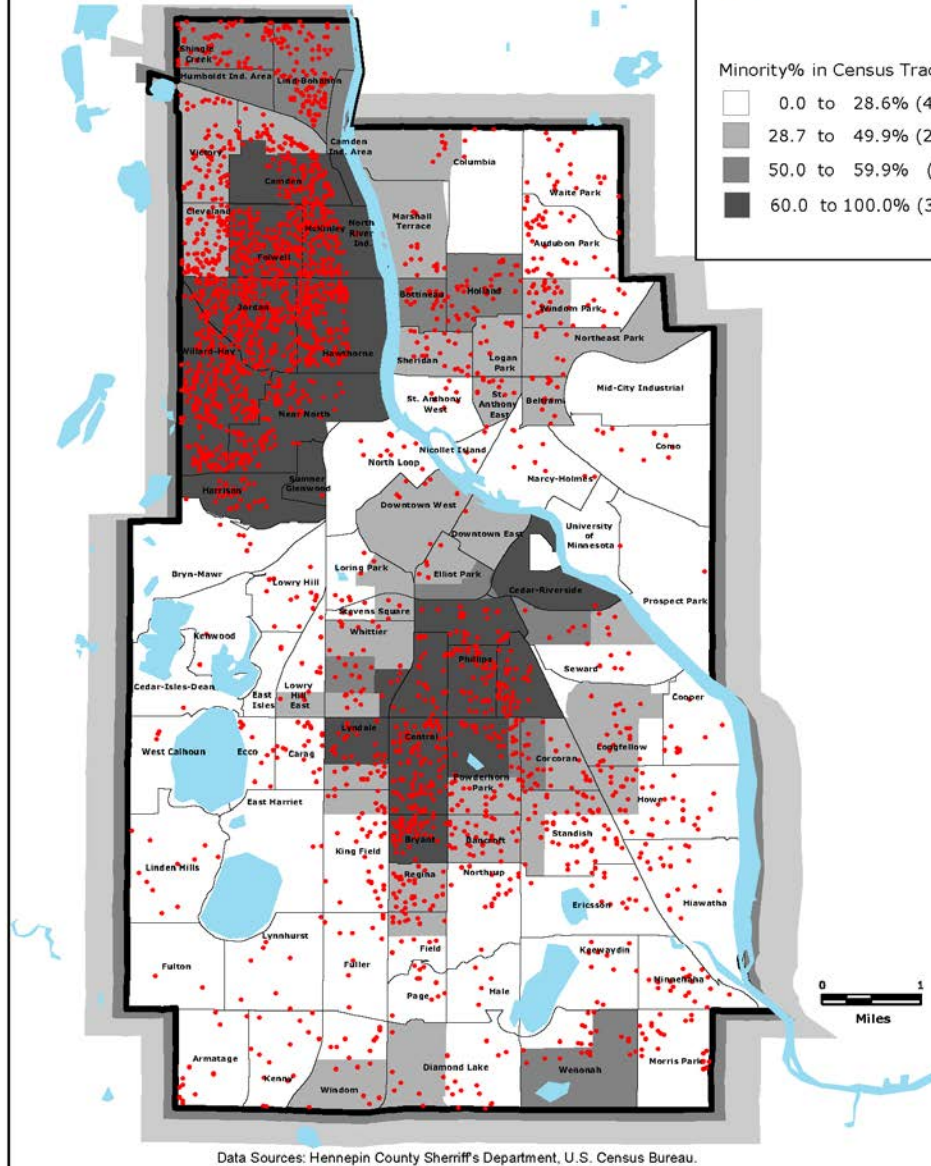

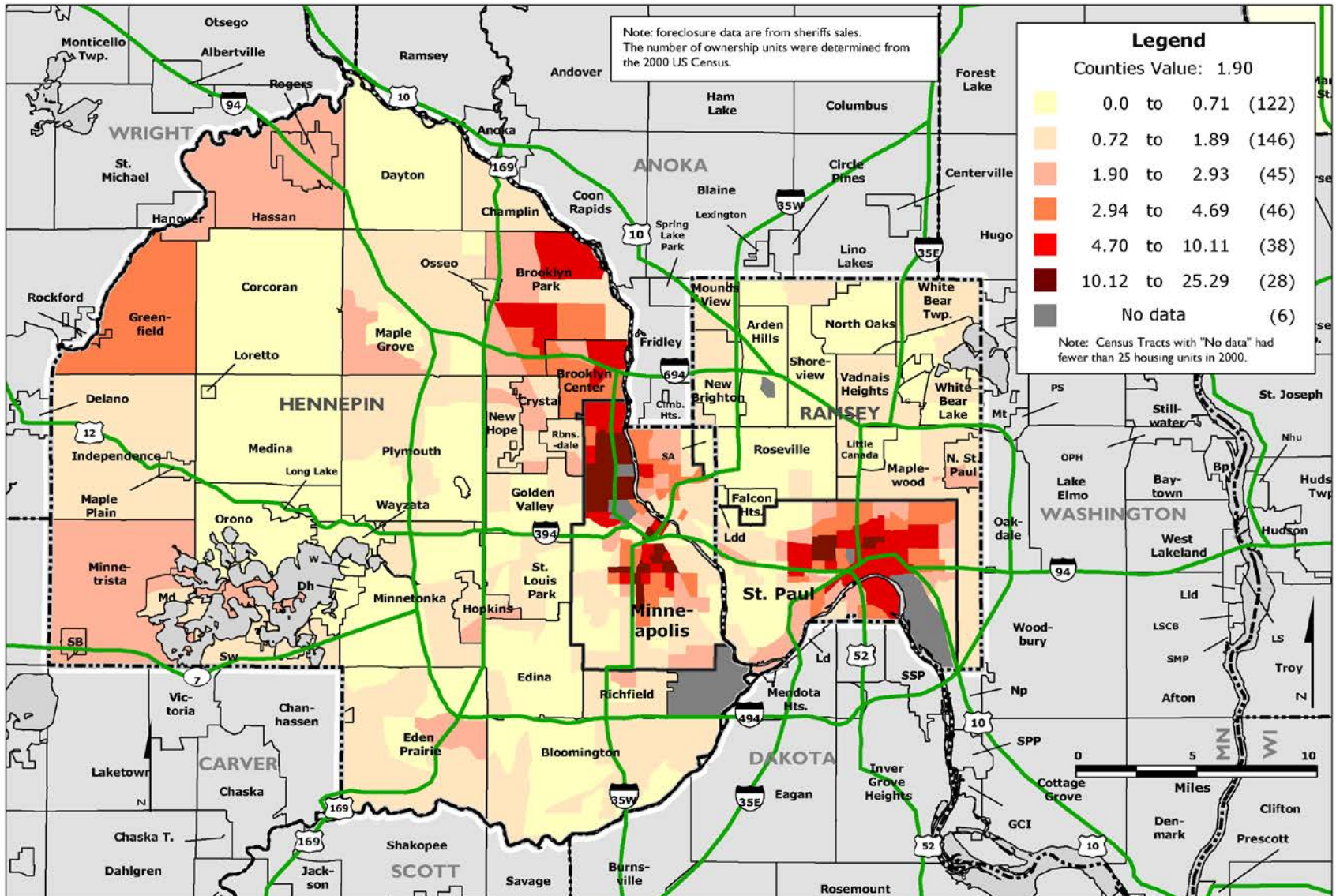

Map 6: HENNEPIN - RAMSEY COUNTIES Foreclosures Per 100 Owner Housing Units by Census Tracts, 2007

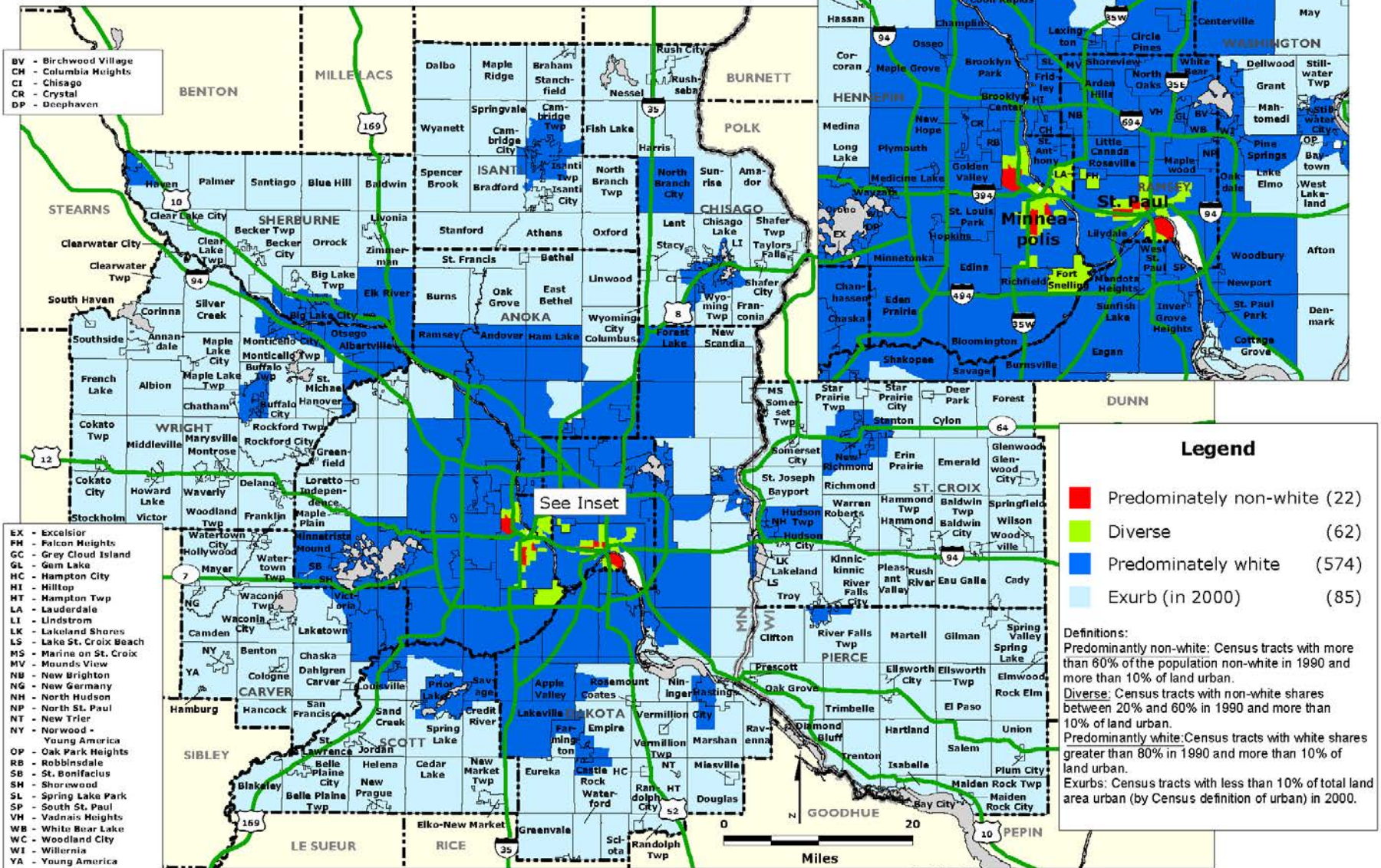

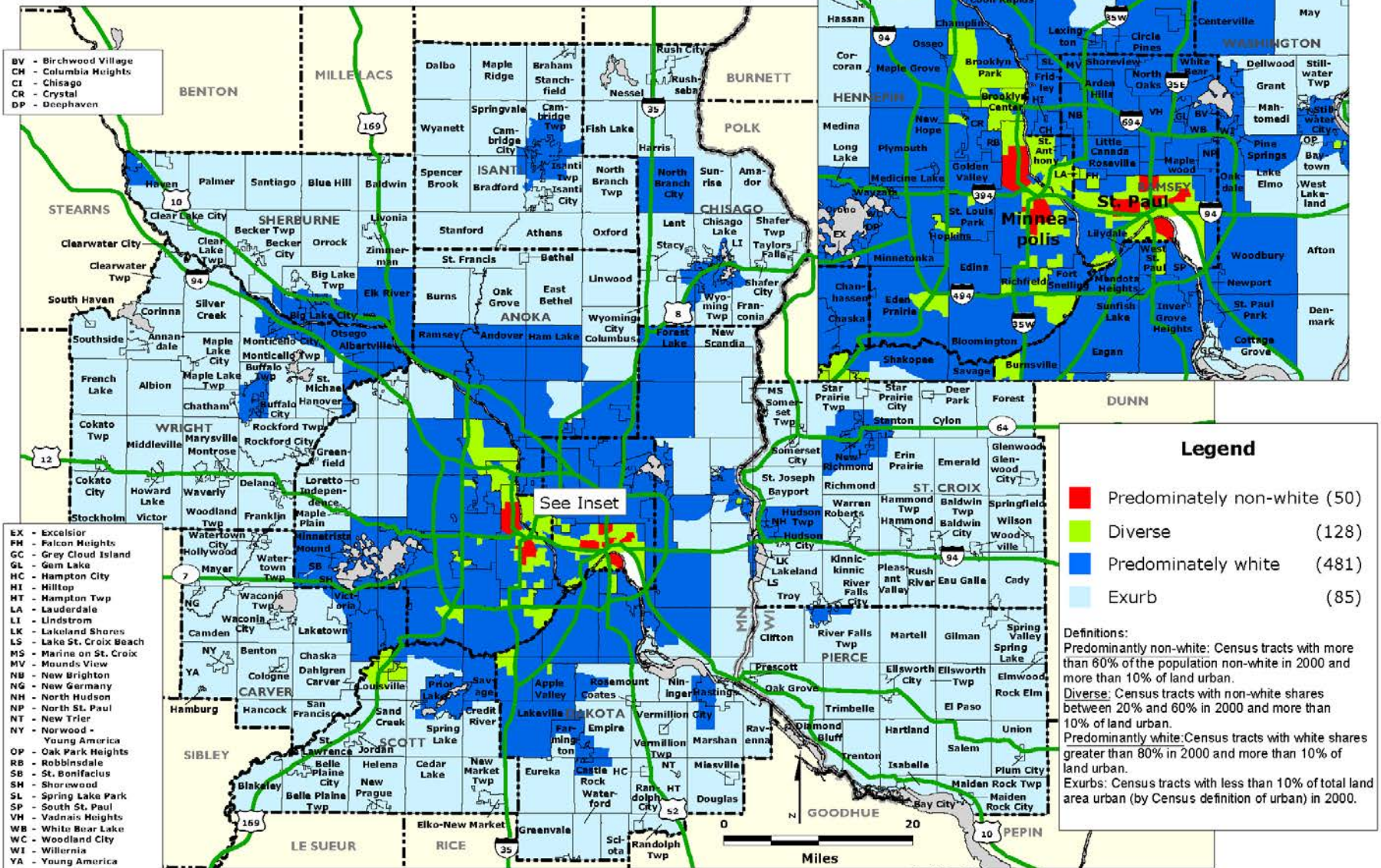
Twin Cities Metro Neighborhood Type 1990-2010

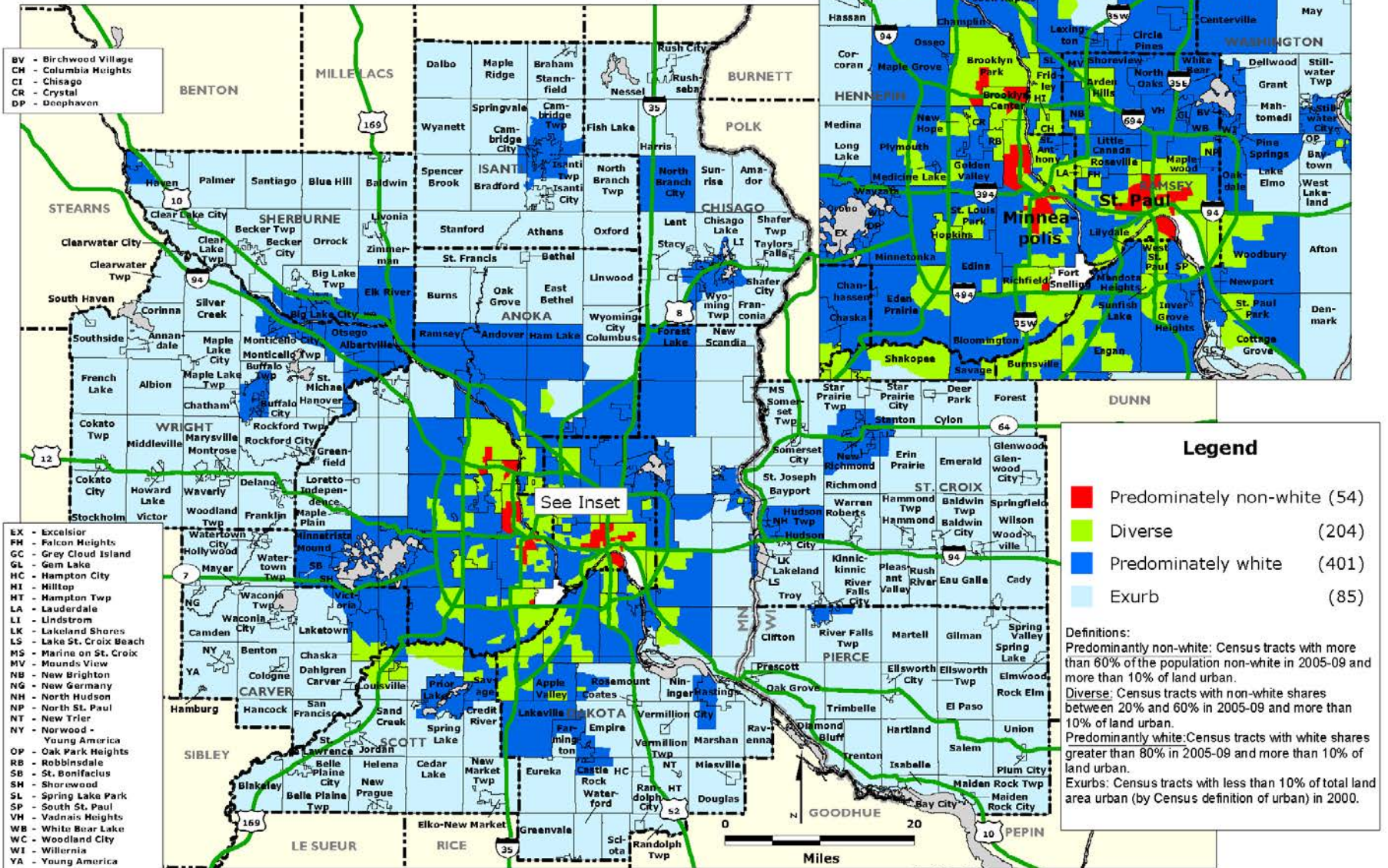

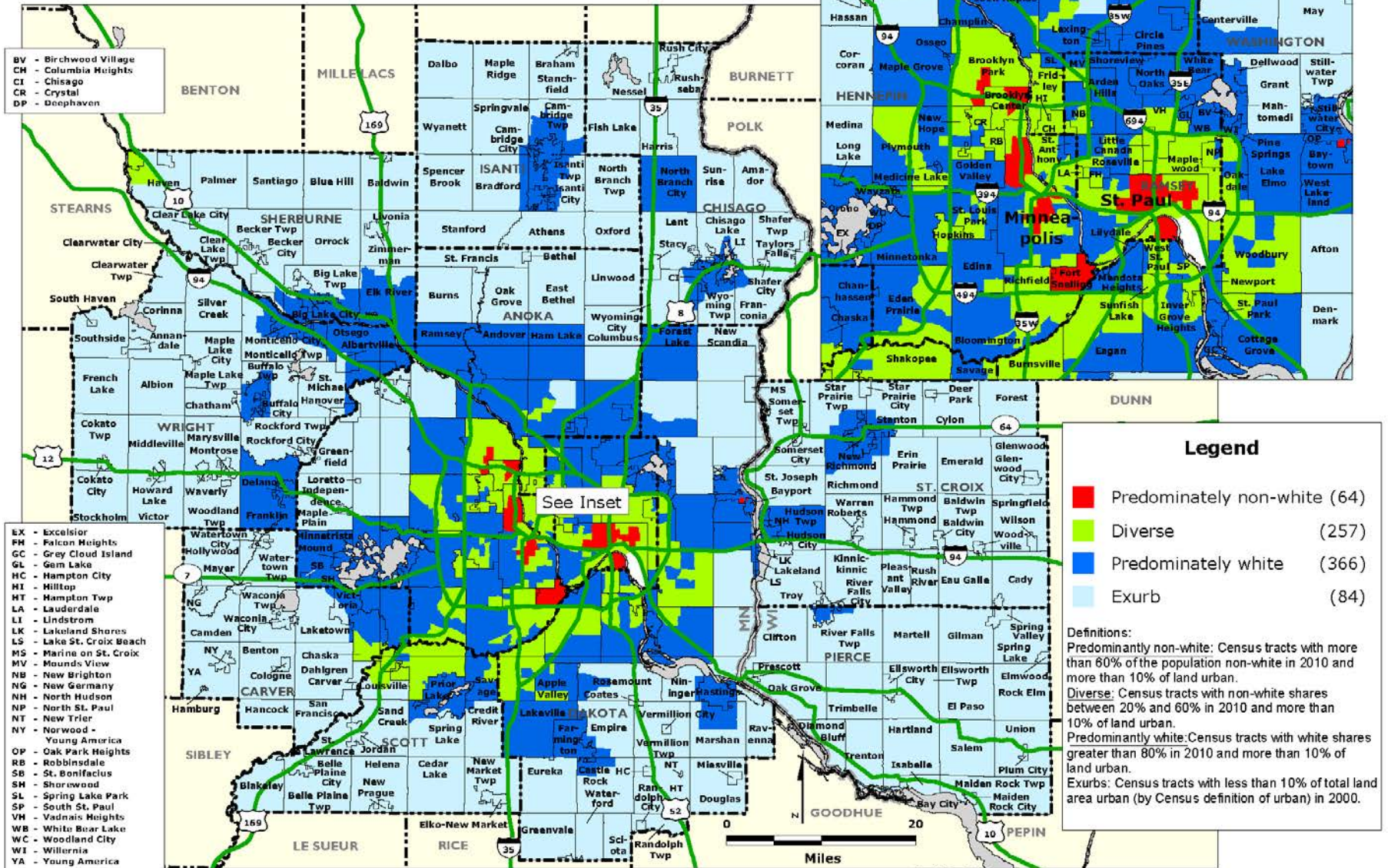

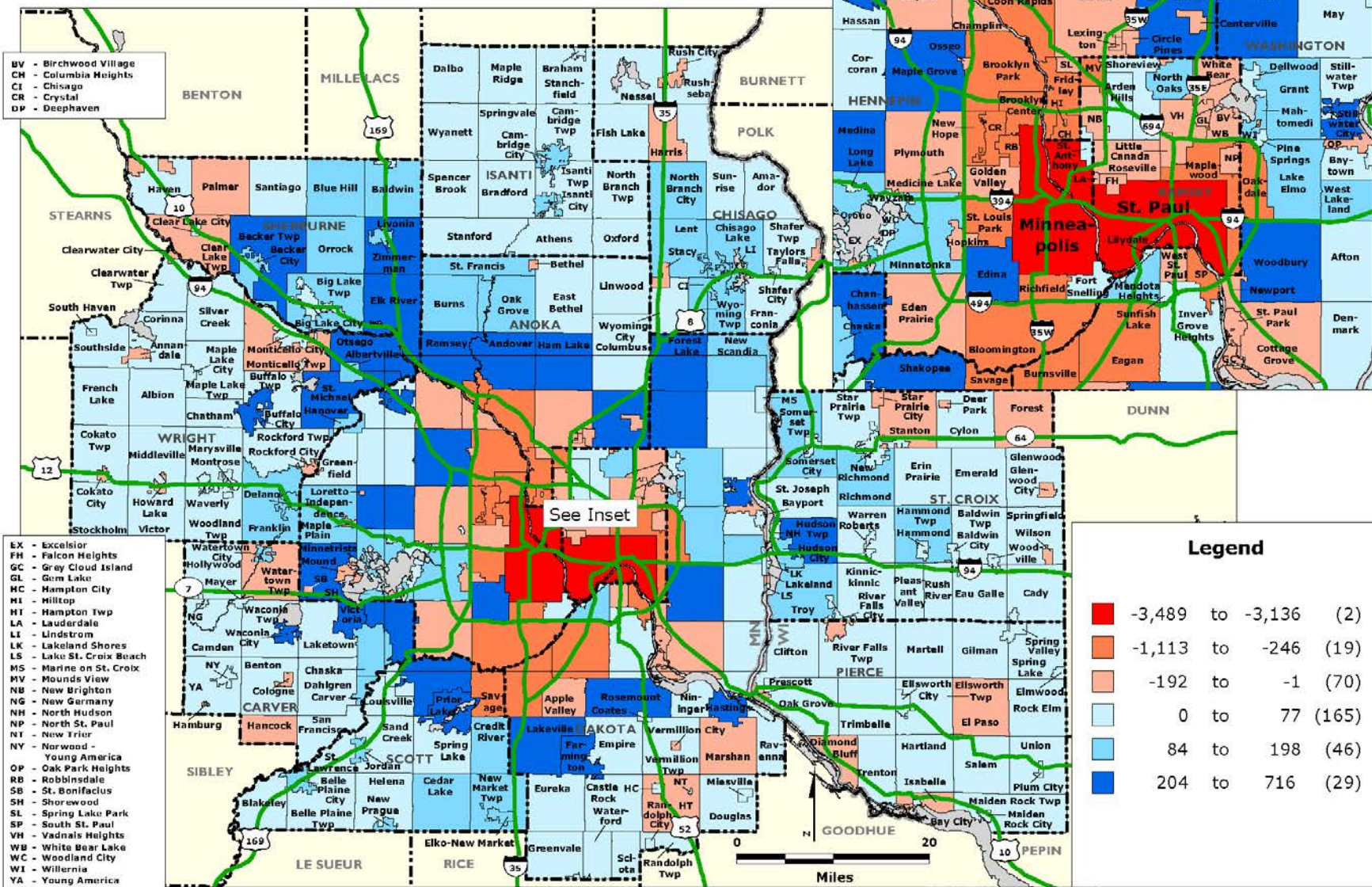




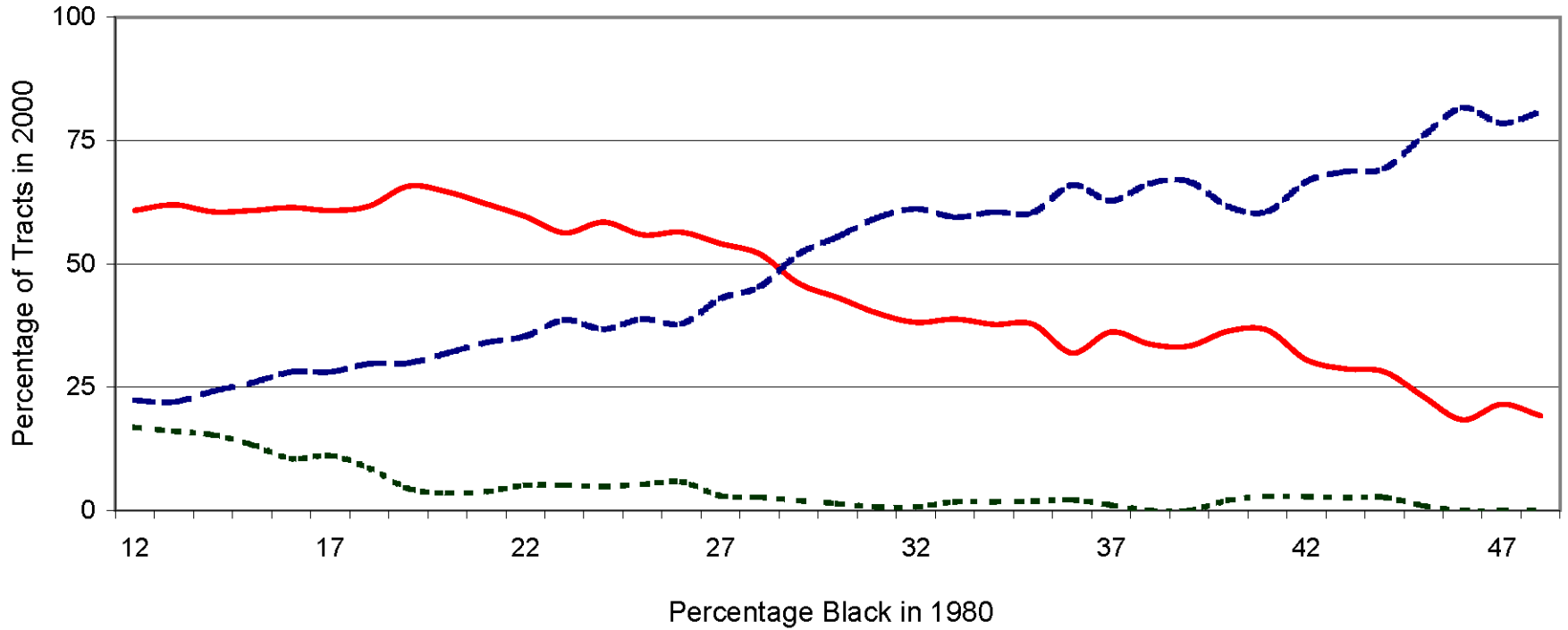
Migration of White Children and Racial Transition

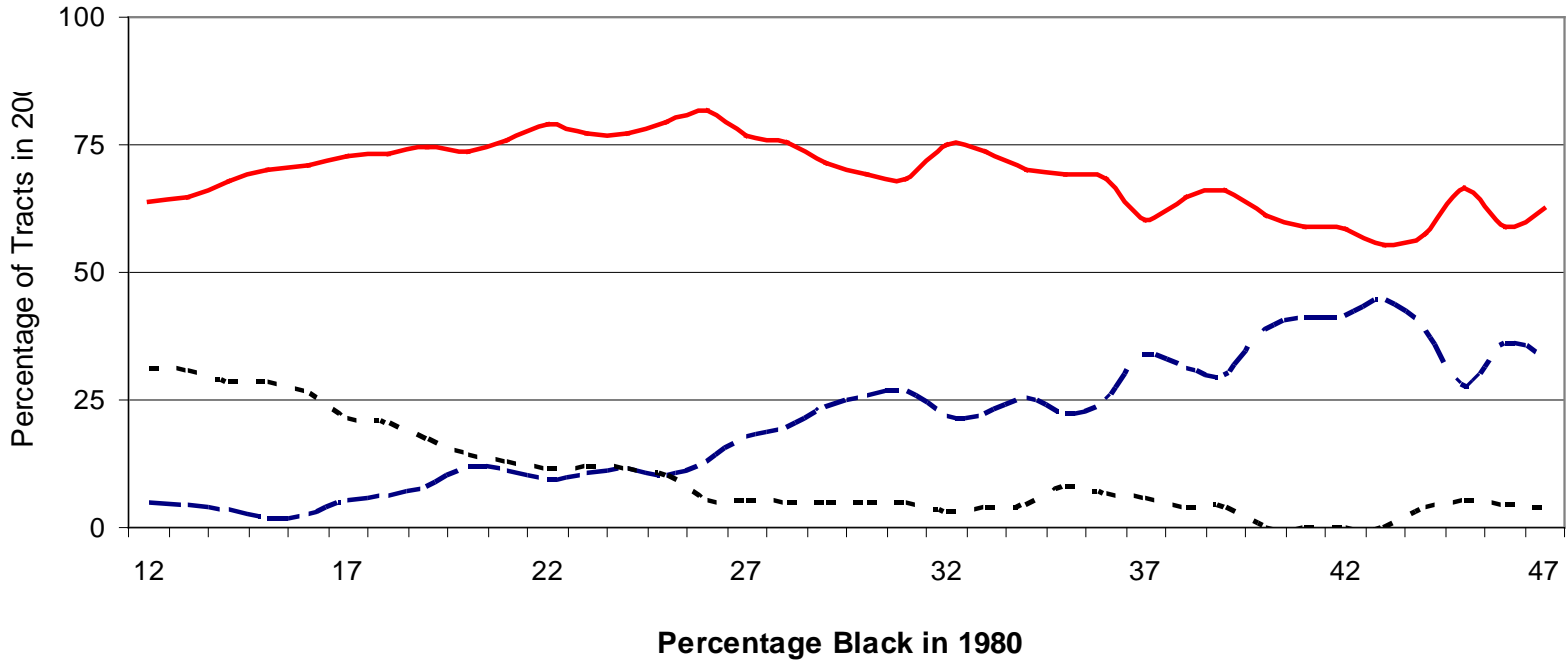
2000 Distribution of 1,592 Tracts that were White/Black Integrated in 1980



Conclusion: When the Black population share was 29% or greater in 1980, the tract was more likely to resegregate during the next 20 years than it was to remain integrated.

Conclusion: Tracts were more likely to remain integrated than to re-segregate during the next 20 years from all starting points.

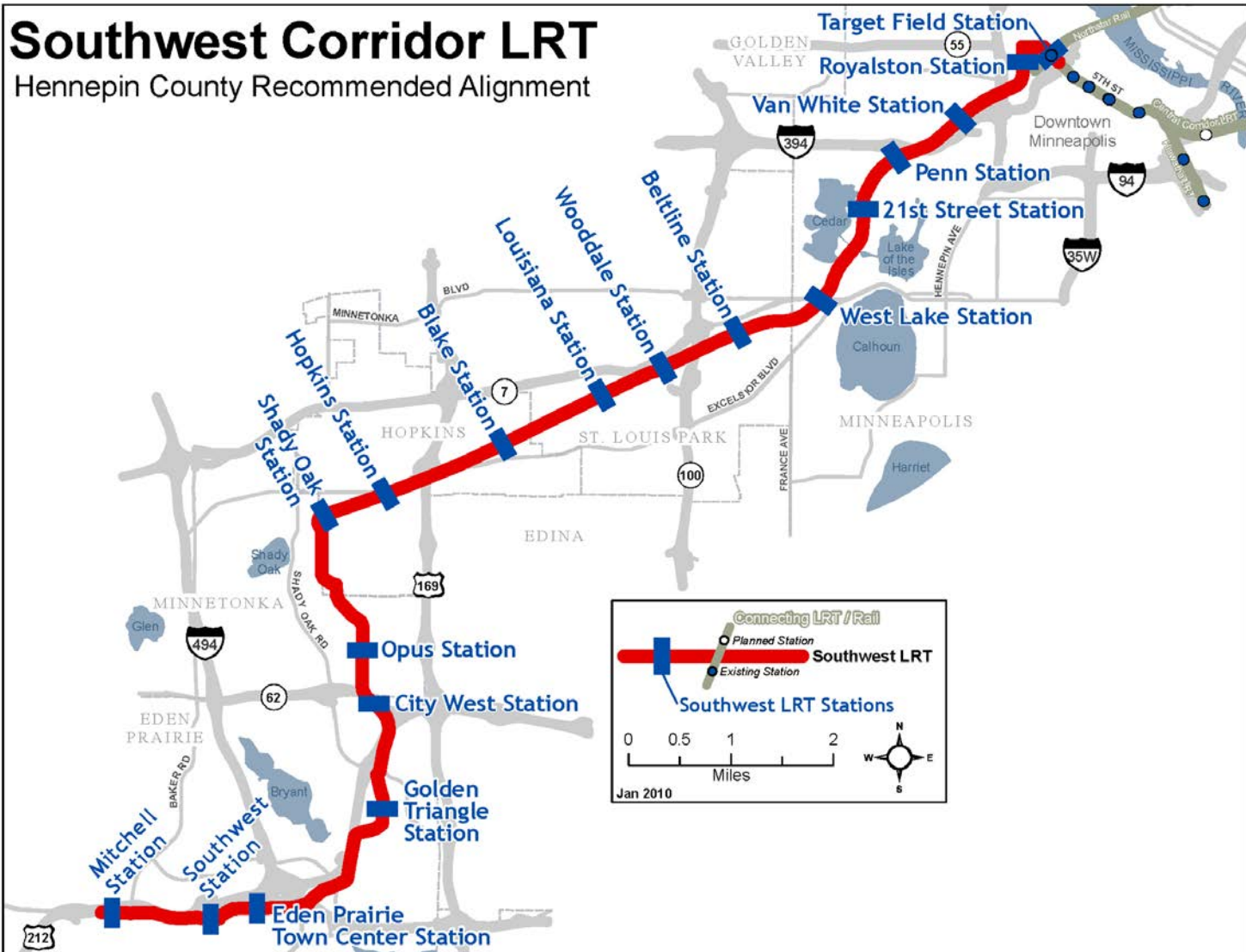

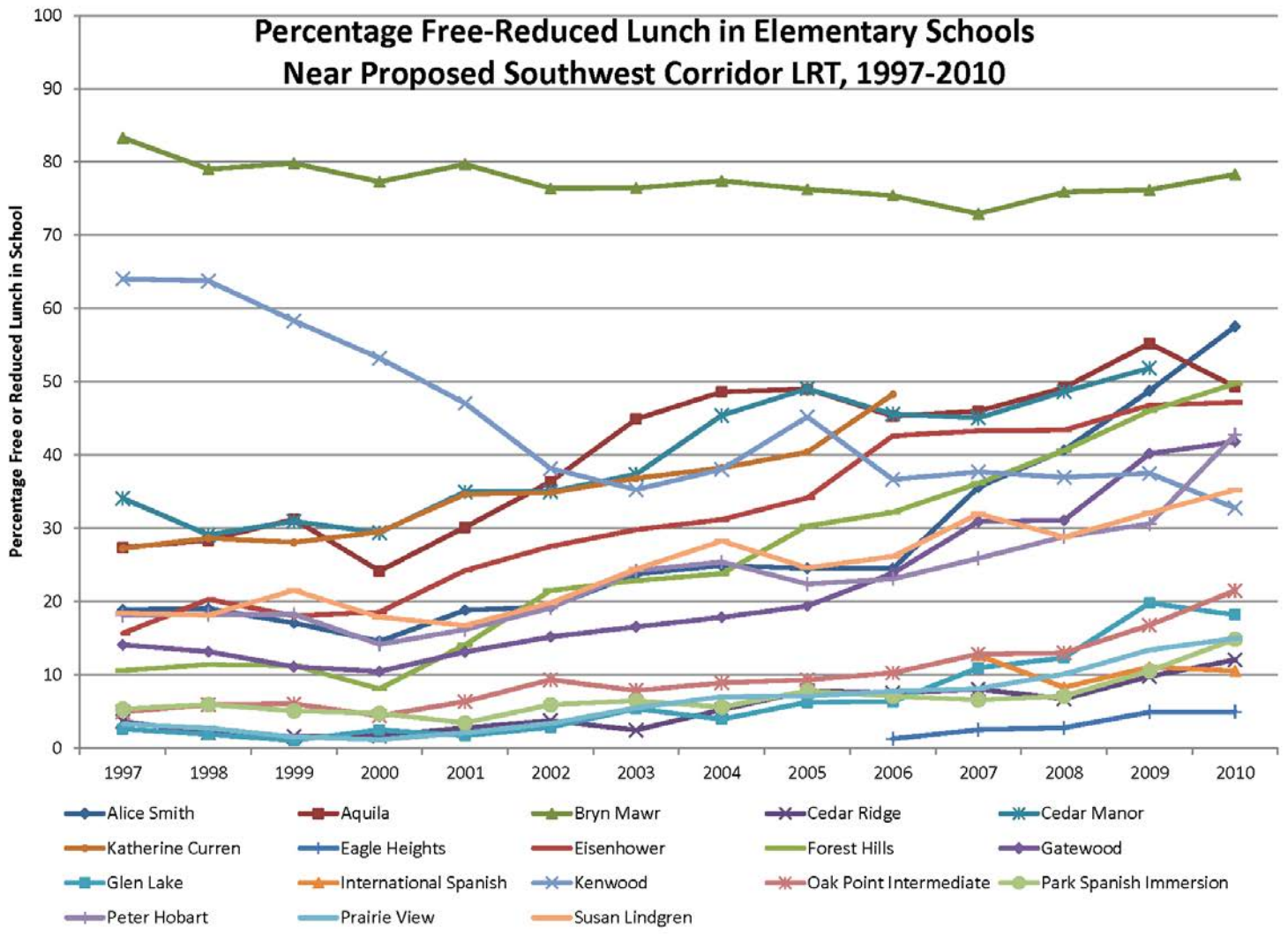

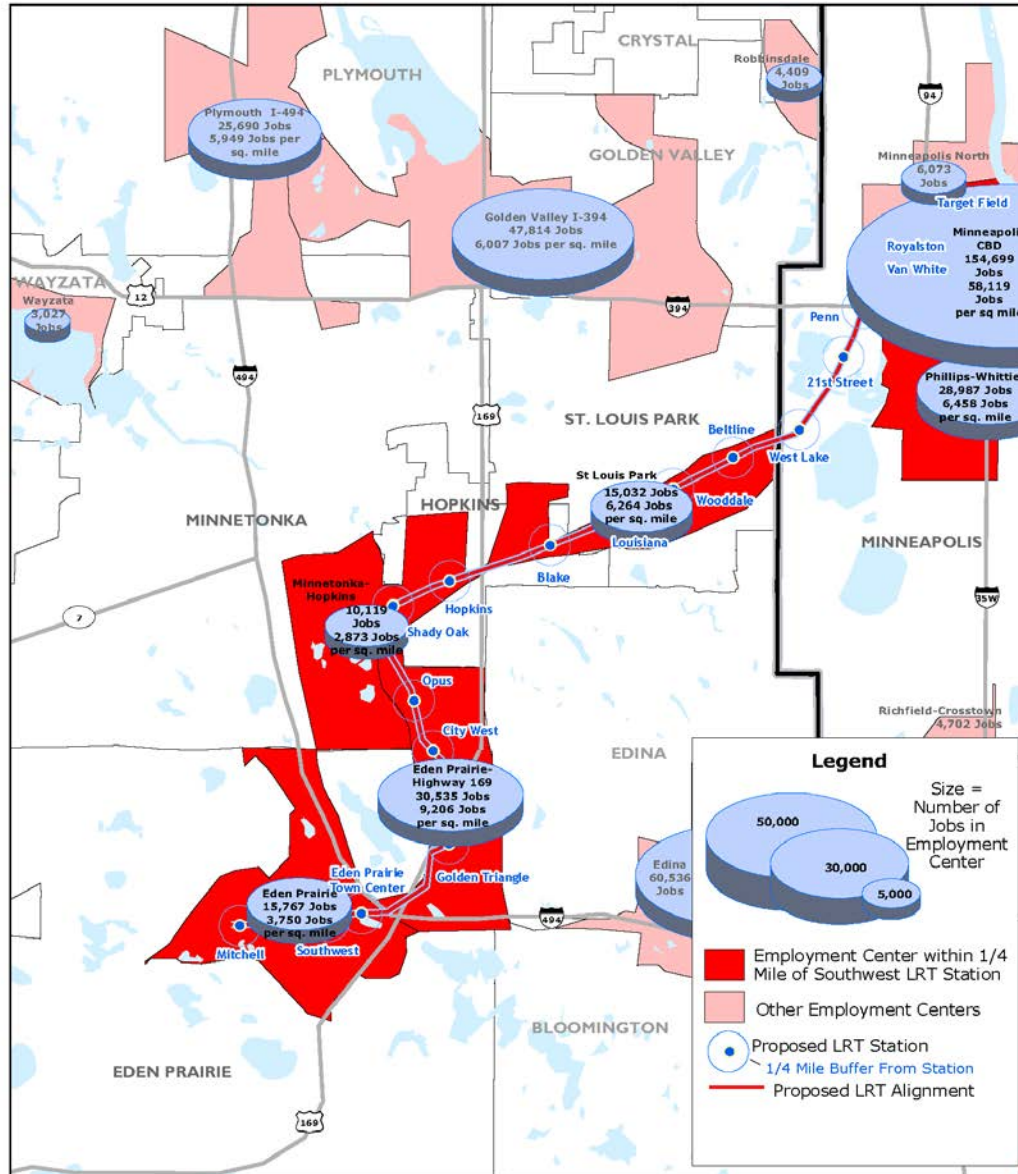

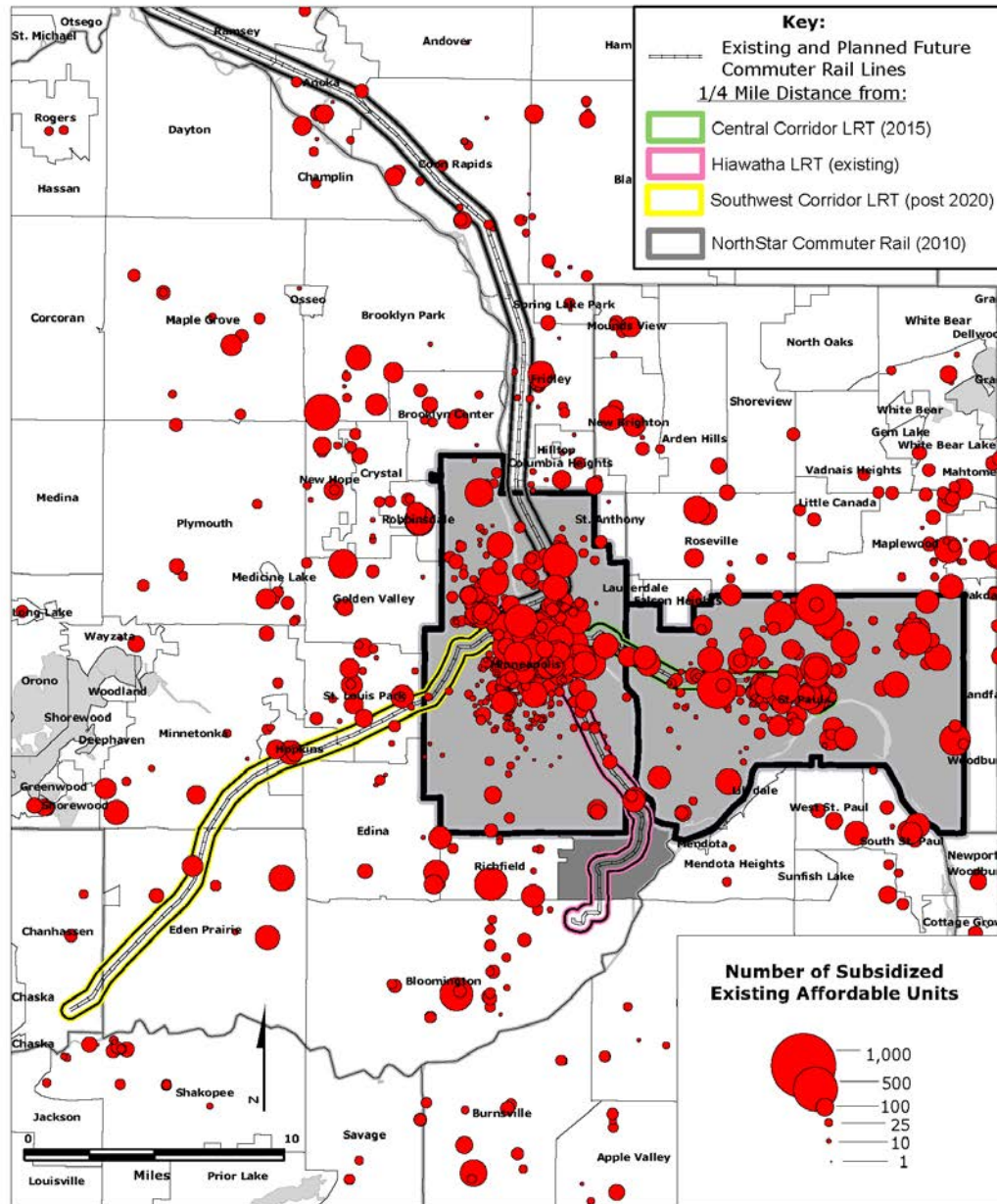
Near Proposed Southwest Corridor Light Rail Transit



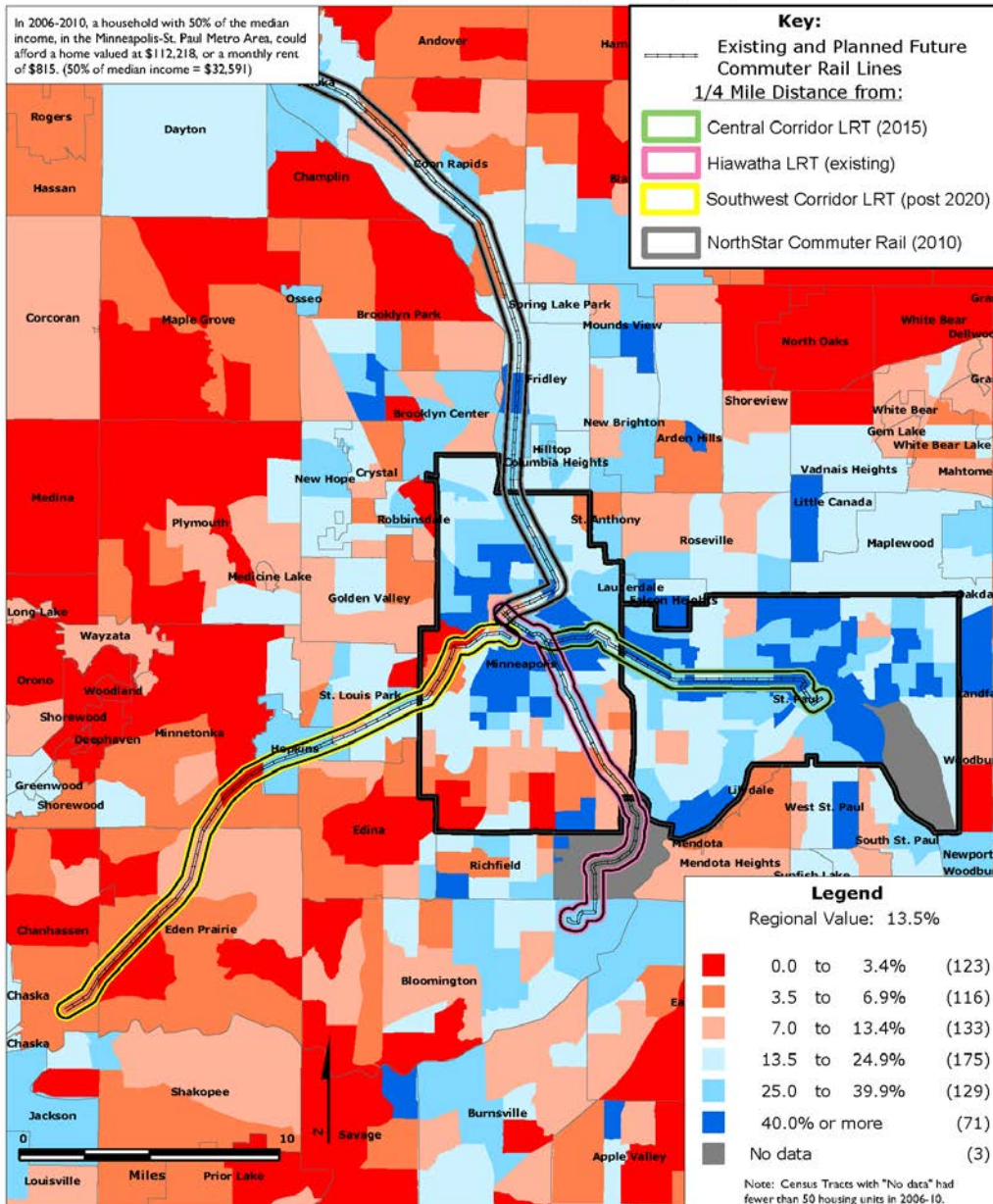

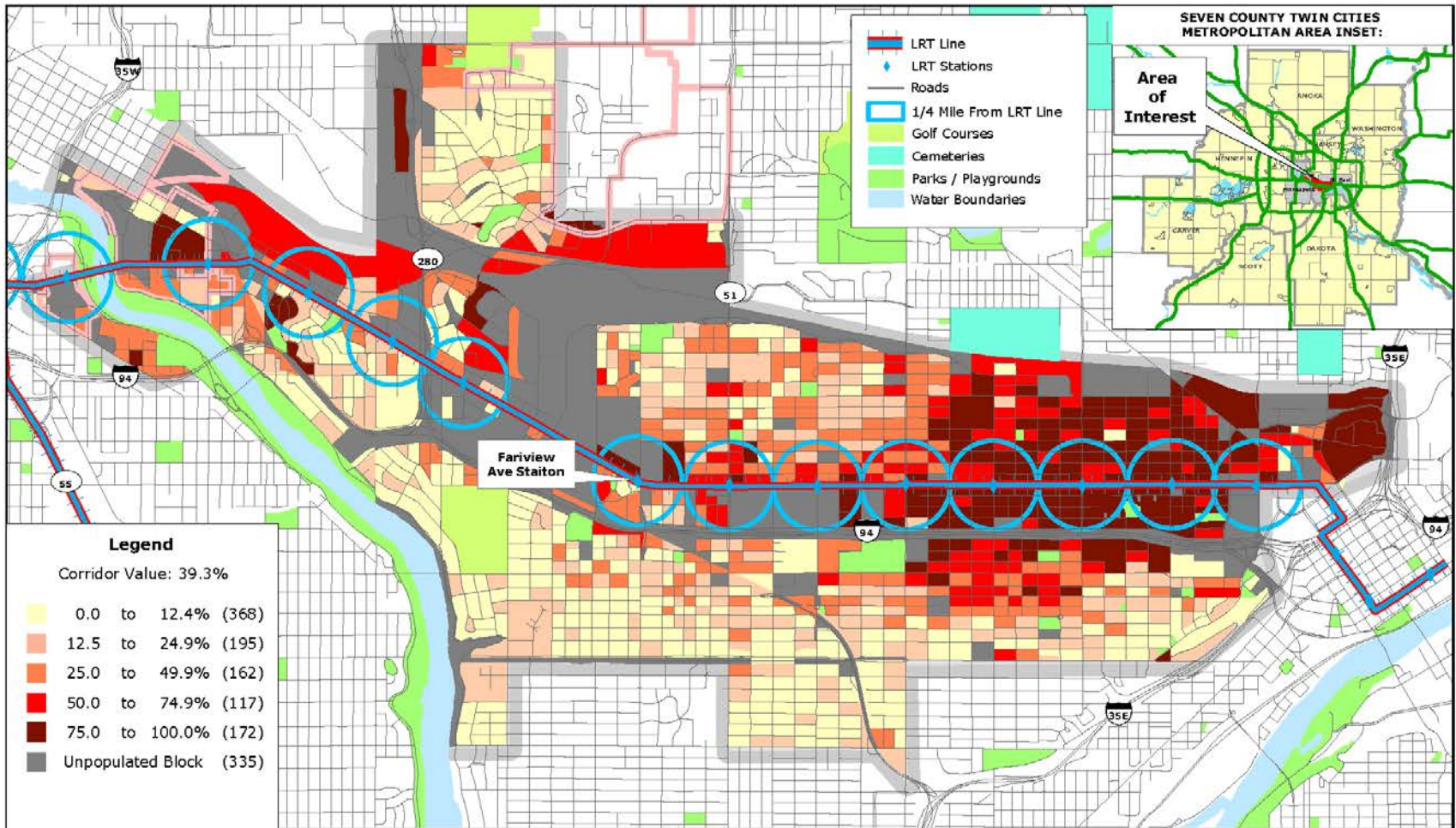

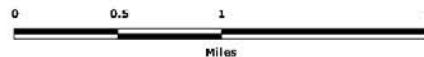

MAP 3: CENTRAL CORRIDOR AREA Percentage Minority Population by Census Block, 2010

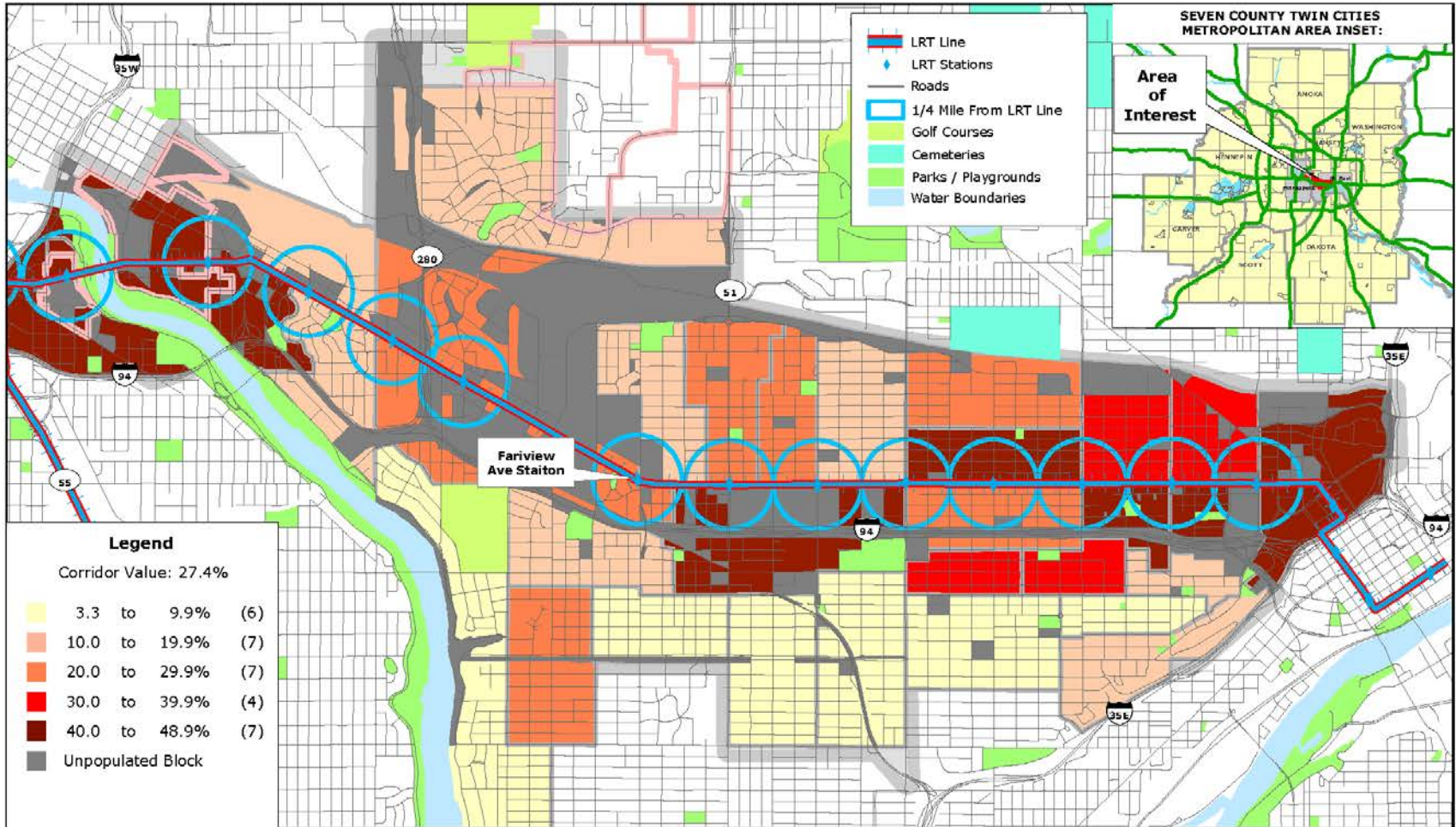

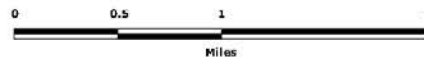

MAP 4: CENTRAL CORRIDOR AREA Percentage Persons Below Poverty Line by Census Tract, 2006-2010 (5-year Average)



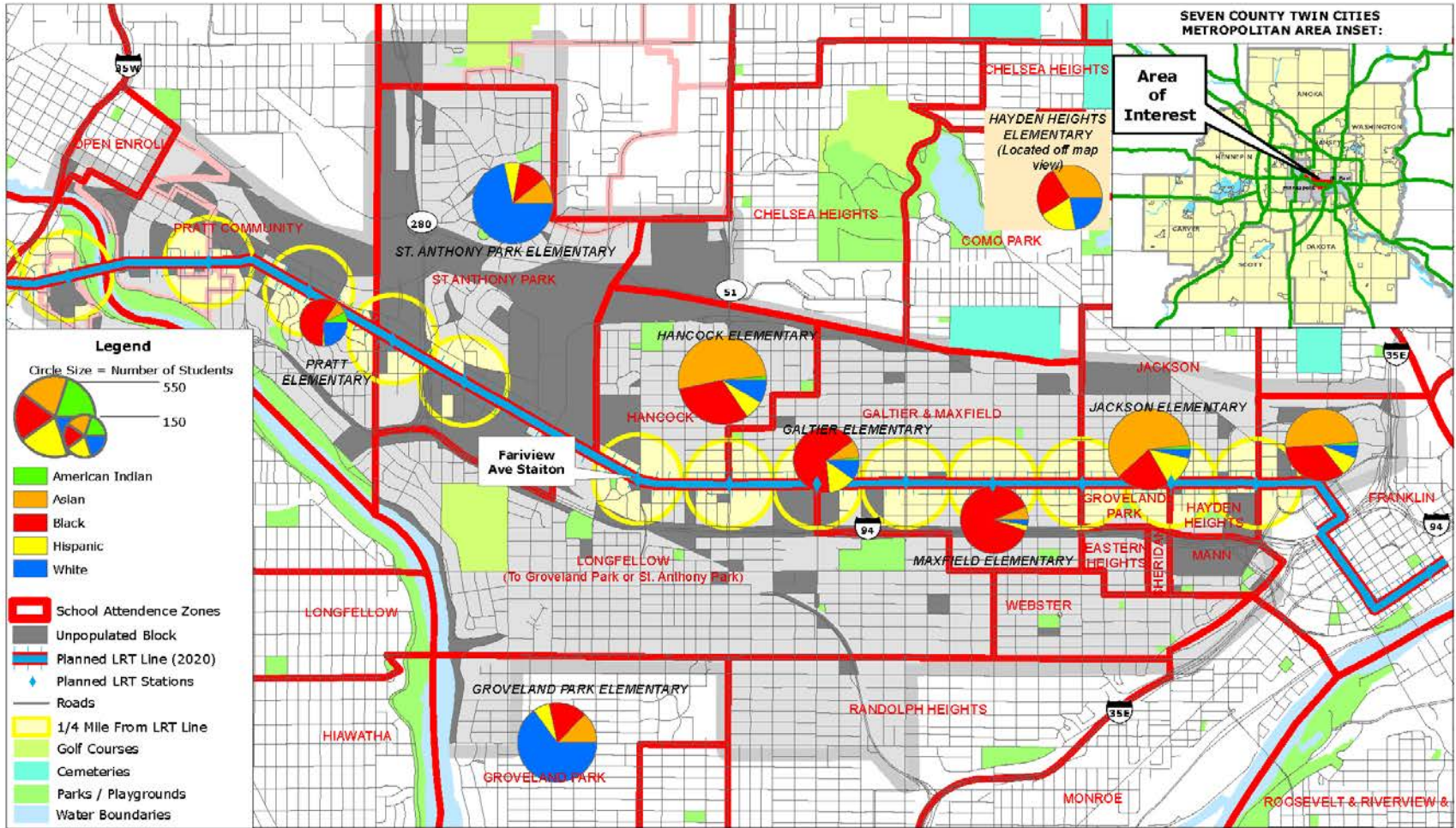

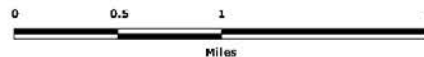

Size and Distribution of Elementary Students by Race for Schools with Attendance Areas within 1/4 mile of LRT Stations, 2009



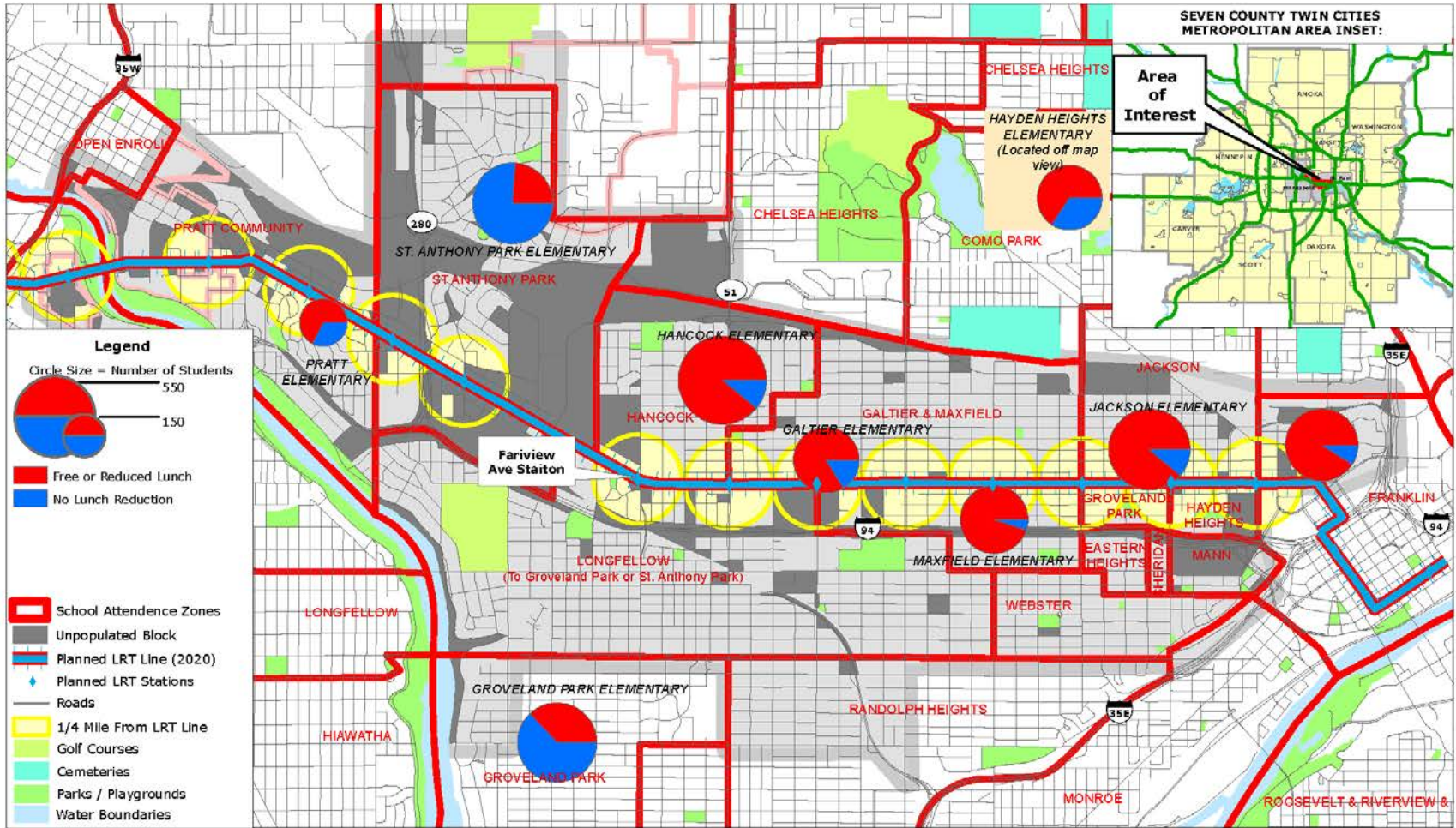

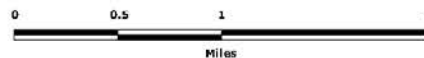

Size and Distribution of Elementary Students by Lunch Status for Schools with Attendance Areas within 1/4 mile of LRT Stations, 2009



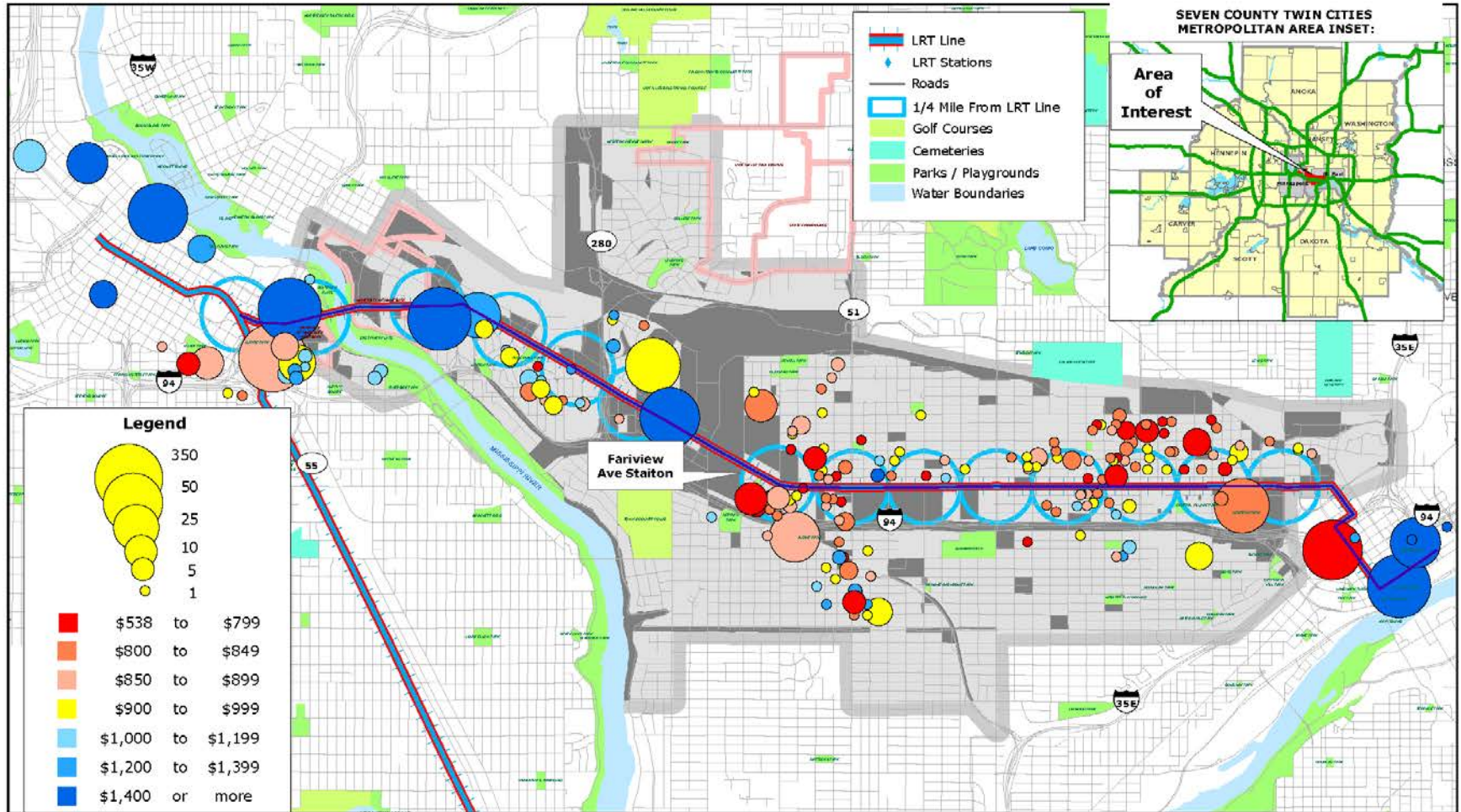

Rental Costs for Market 2-Bedroom Unit by Number of Units in Survey Locations, 2011



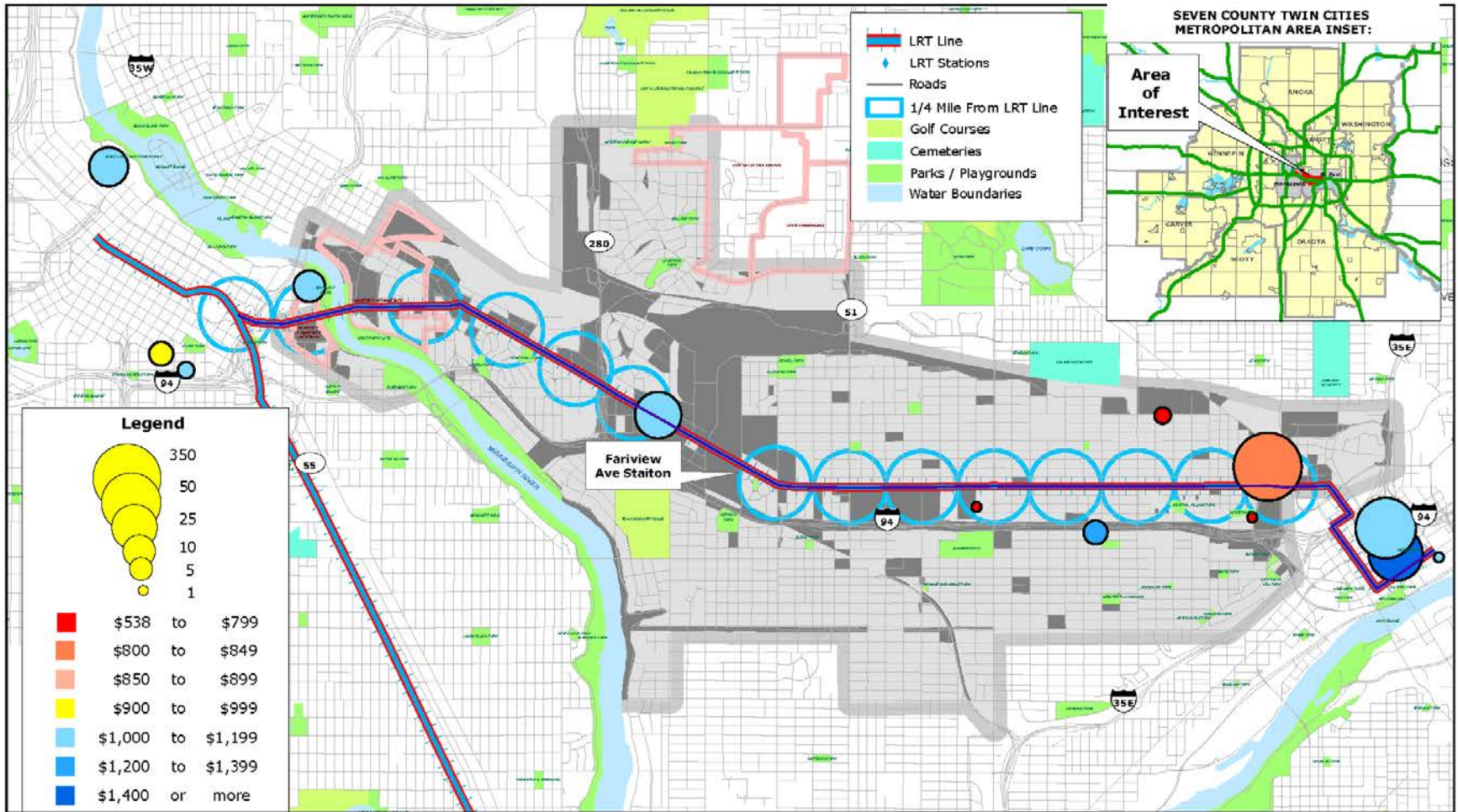

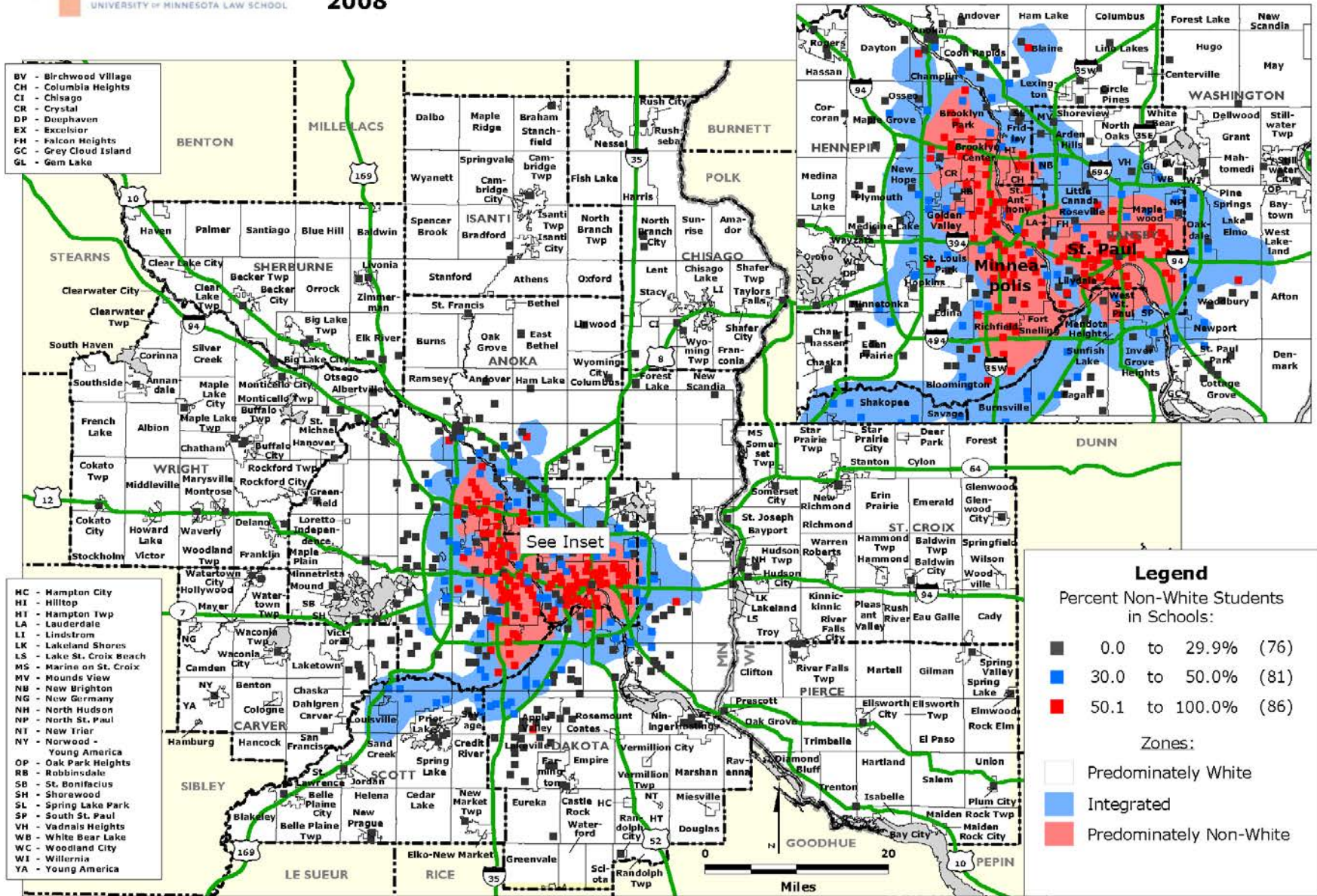

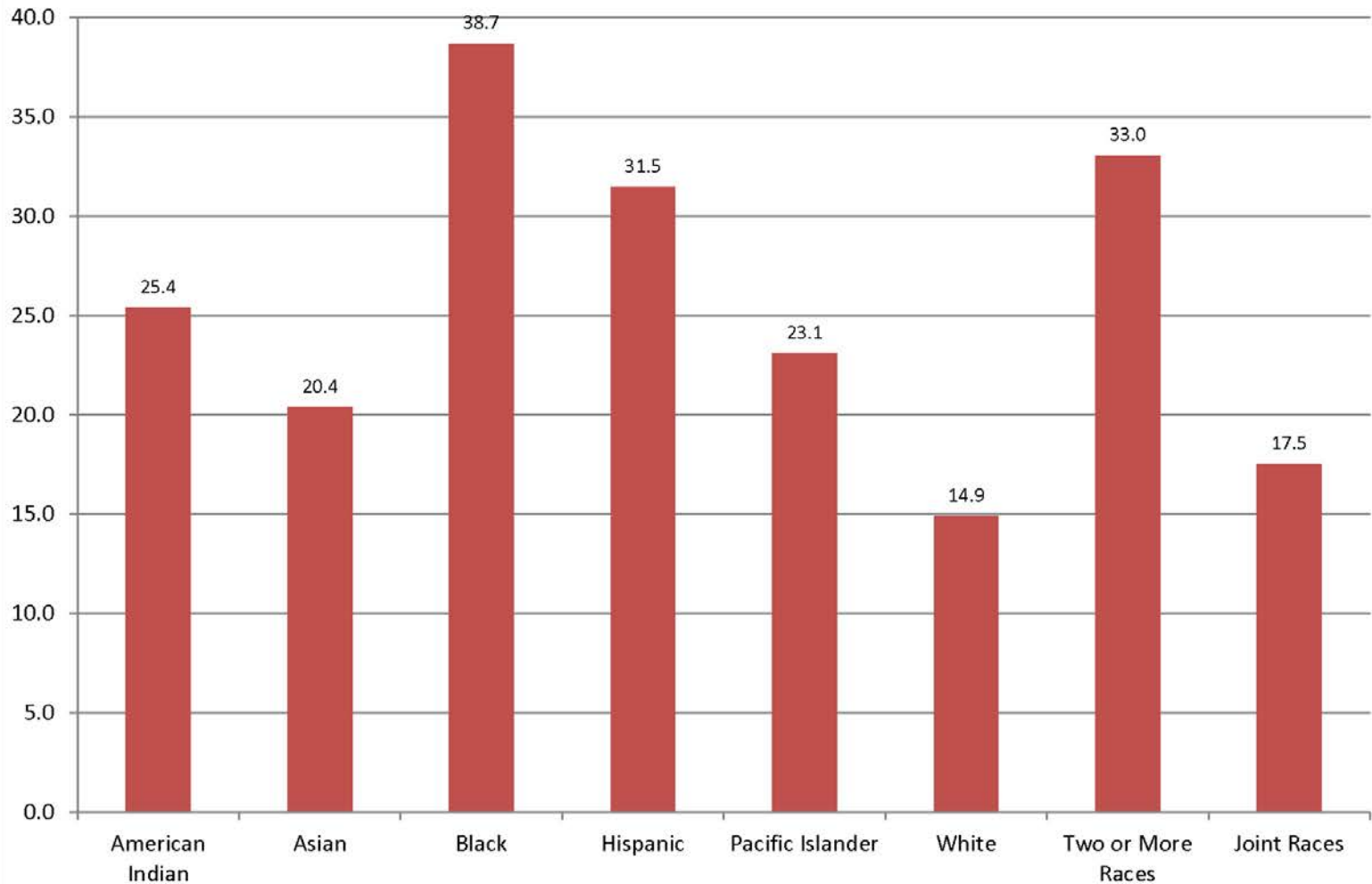

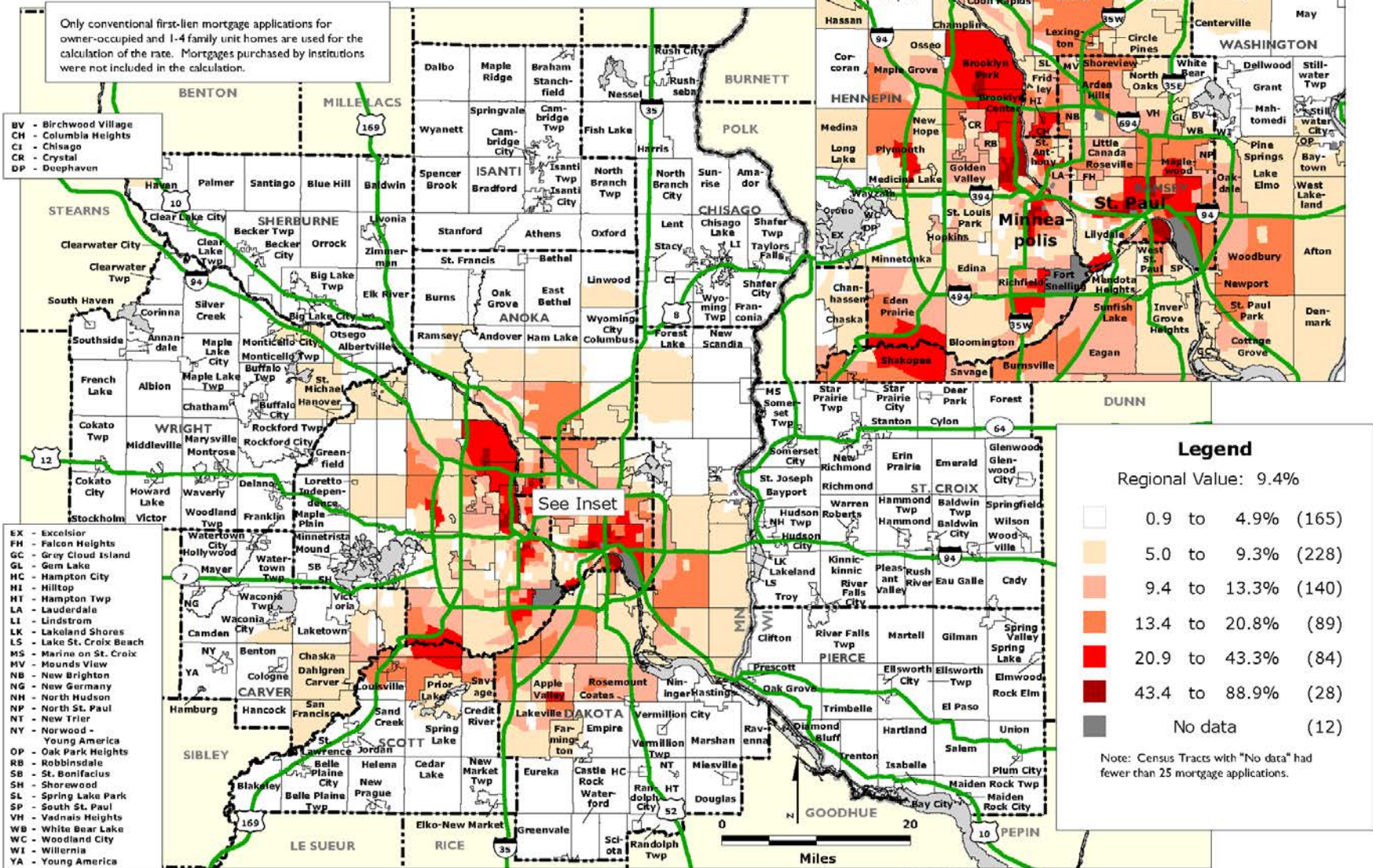


Mortgage Denial Rates

Percentage of Home Loan Applications Denied by Lending Institution in Twin Cities, 2008-2010

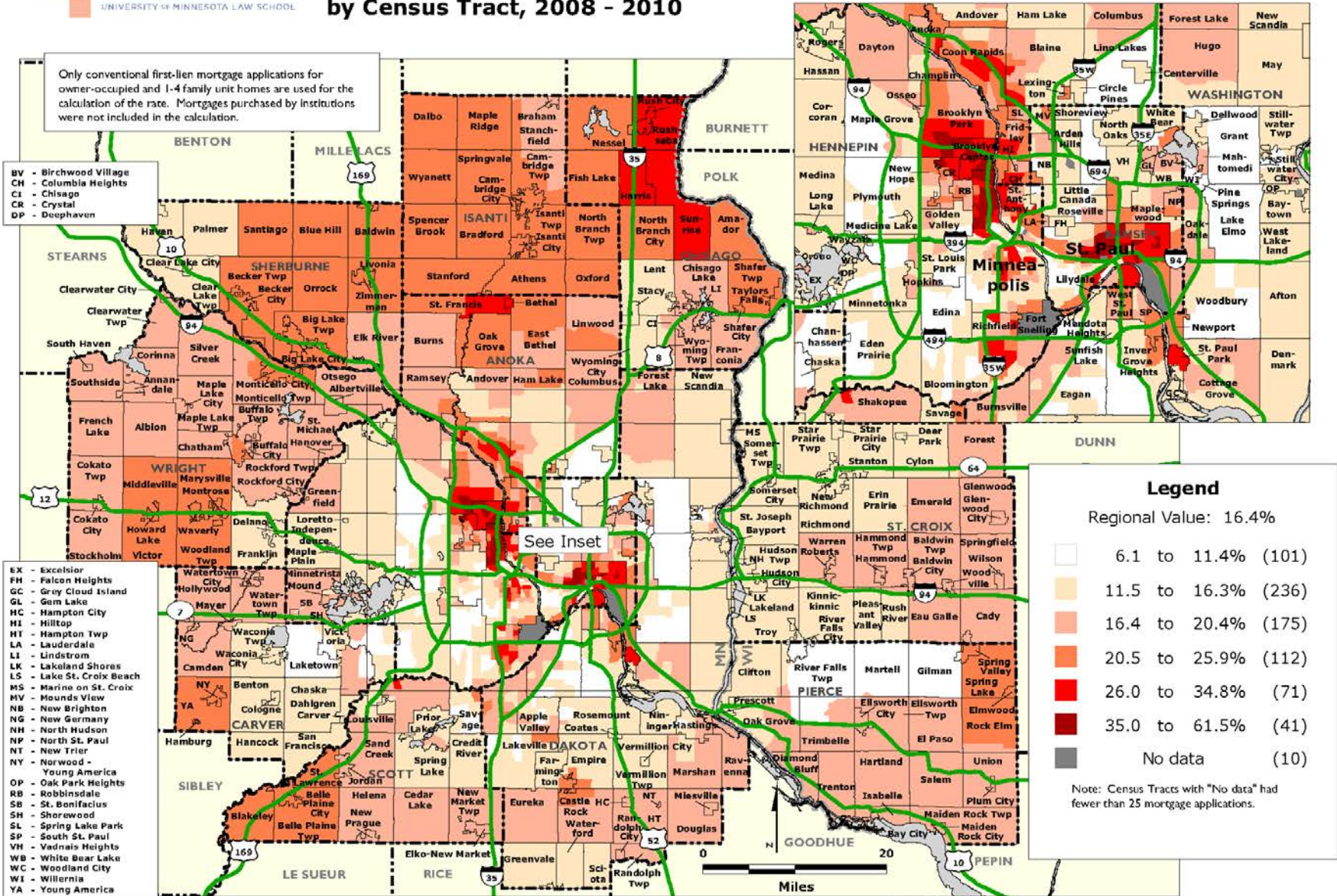

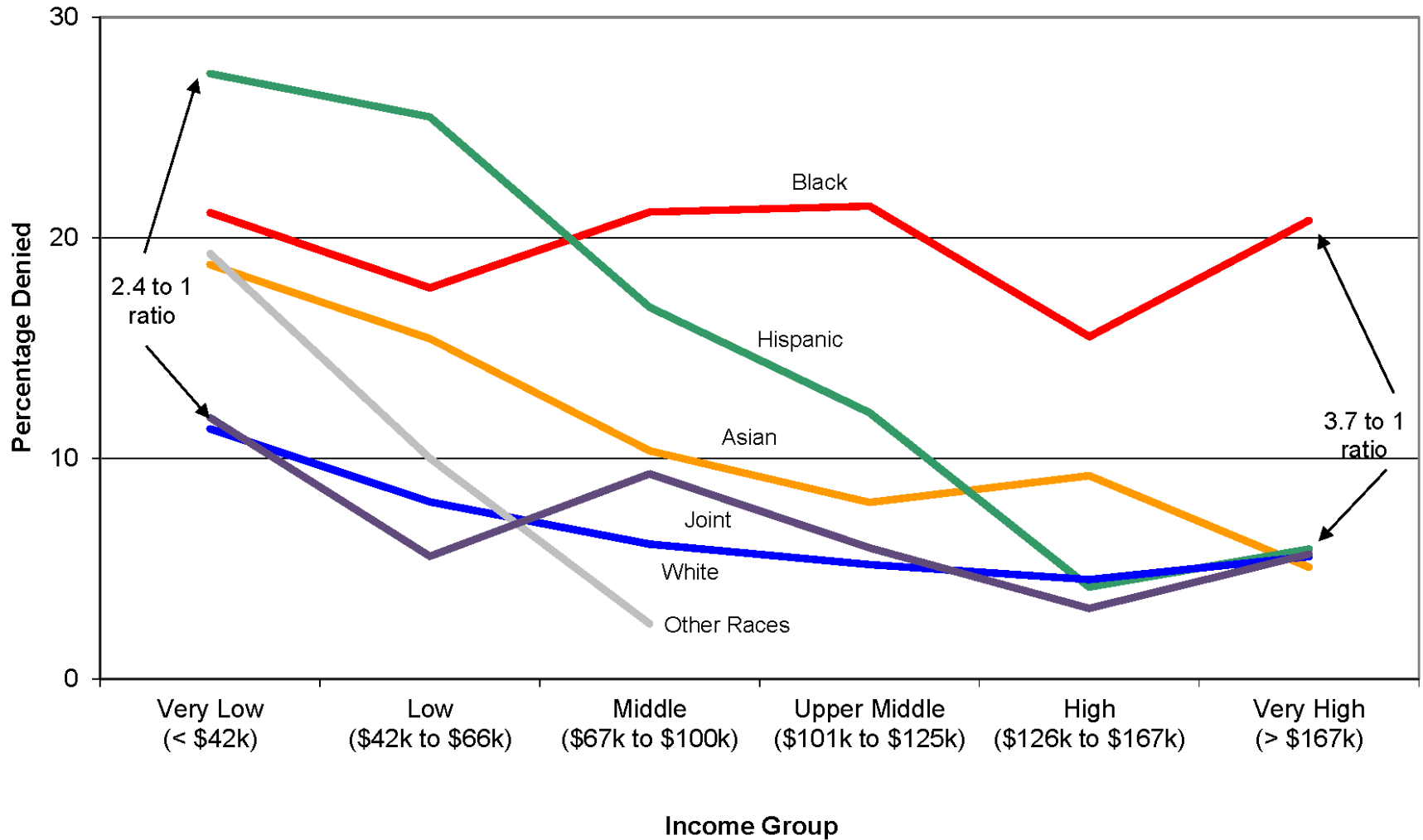

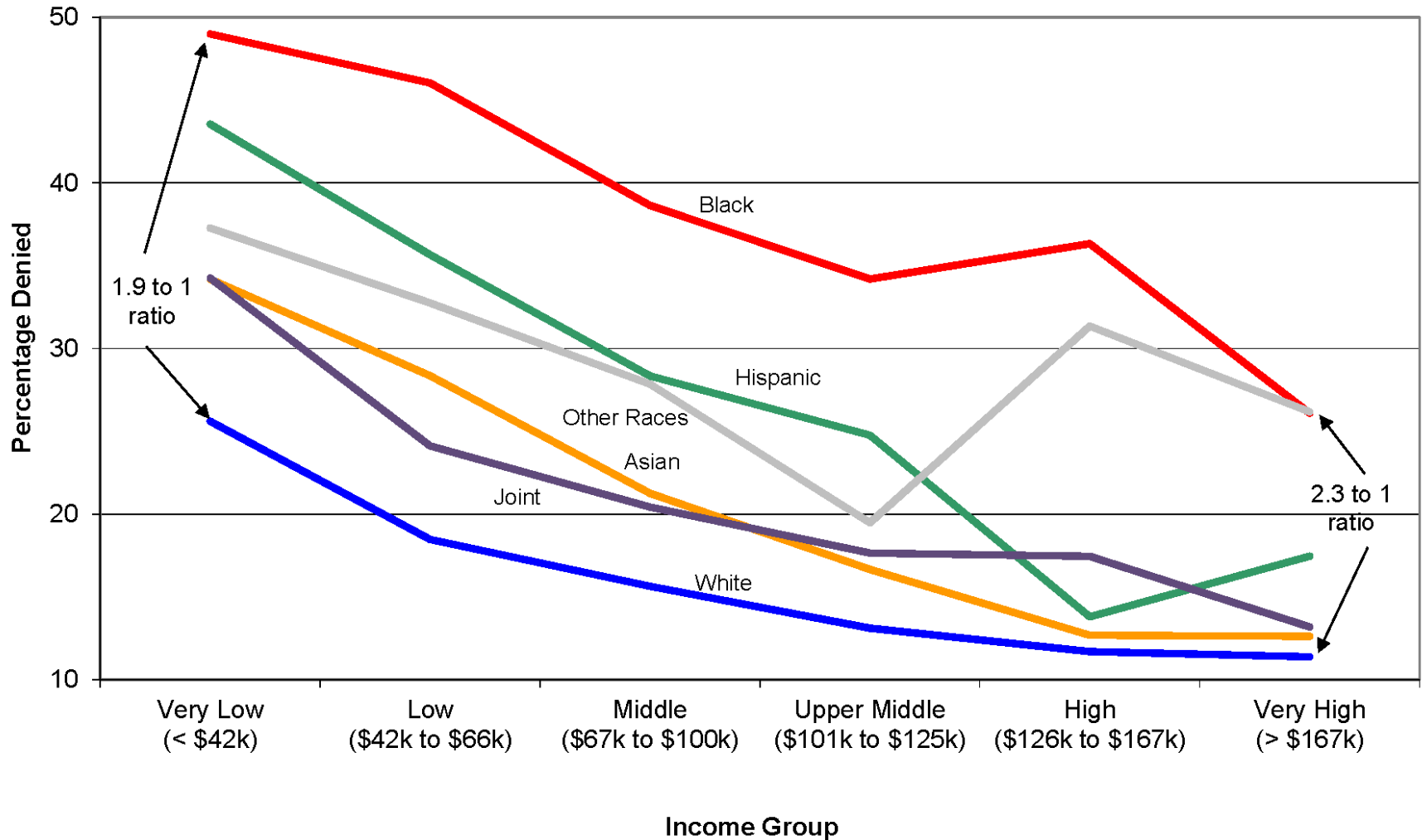
MINNEAPOLIS-SAINTE PAUL REGION: Home Mortgage Denial Rates by Census Tract, 2008 - 2010



Twin Cities, Percentage of Home Purchase Loan Applications Denied by Race and Income, 2008-2010



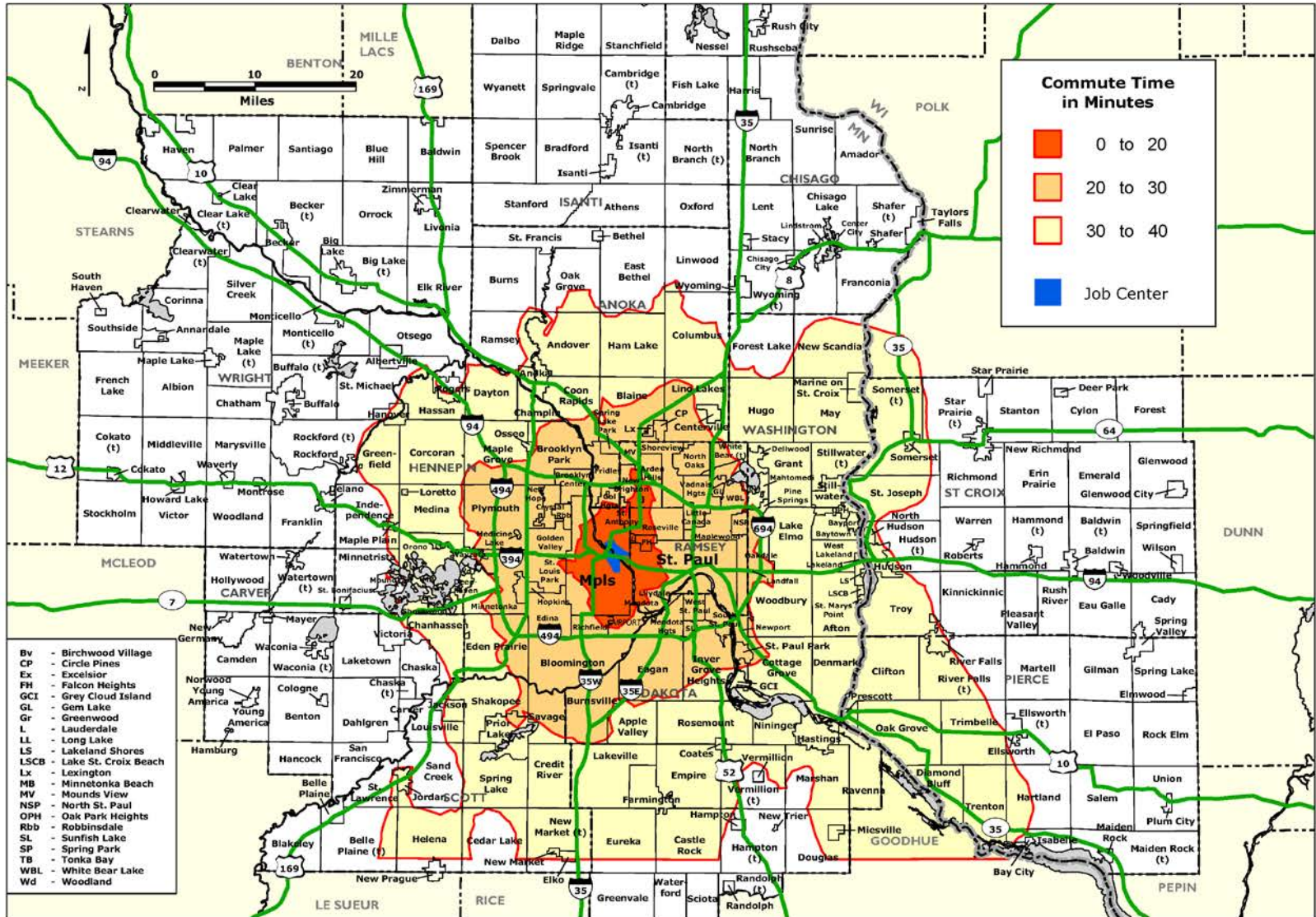

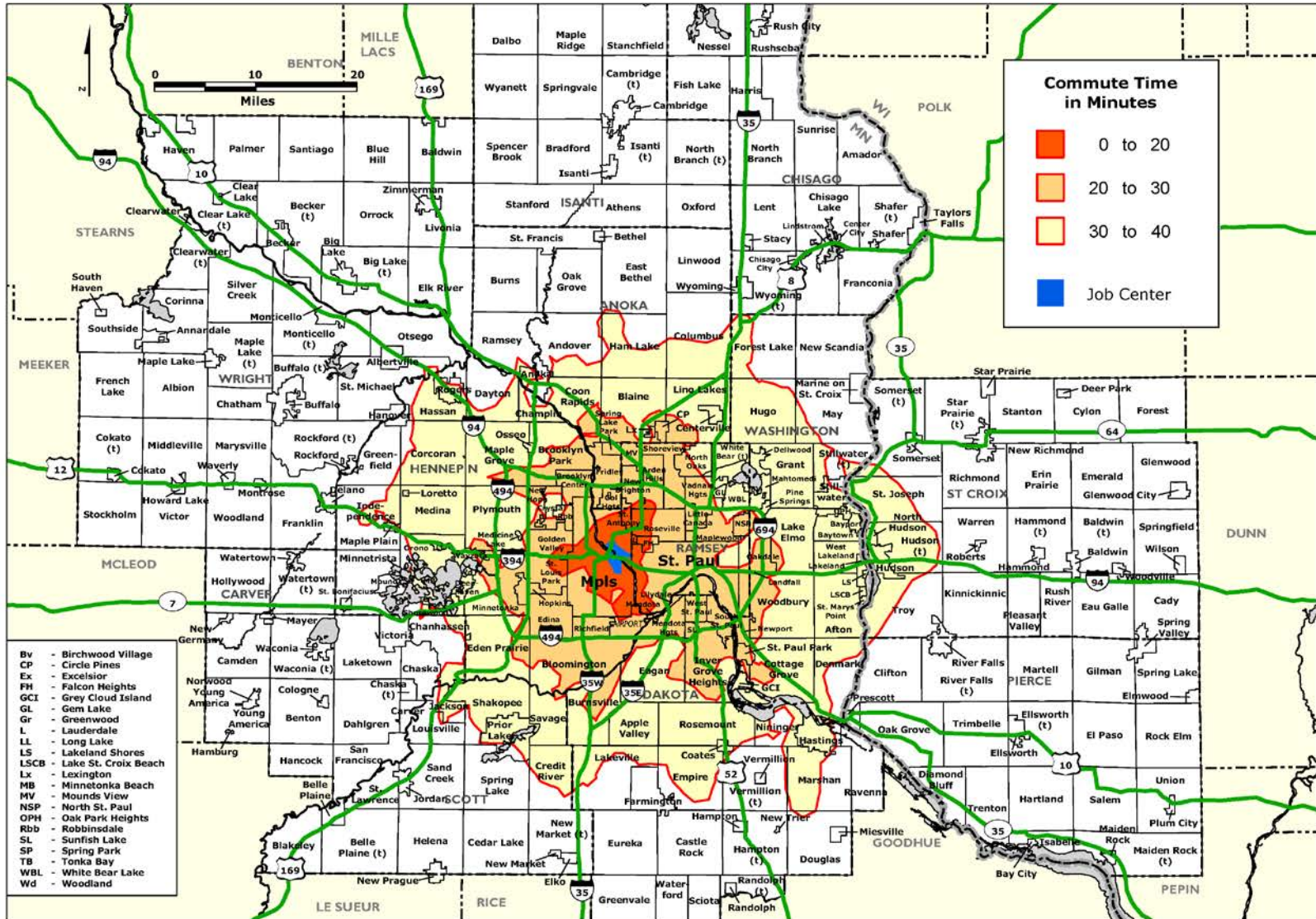

University 1990 Commuter-Shed



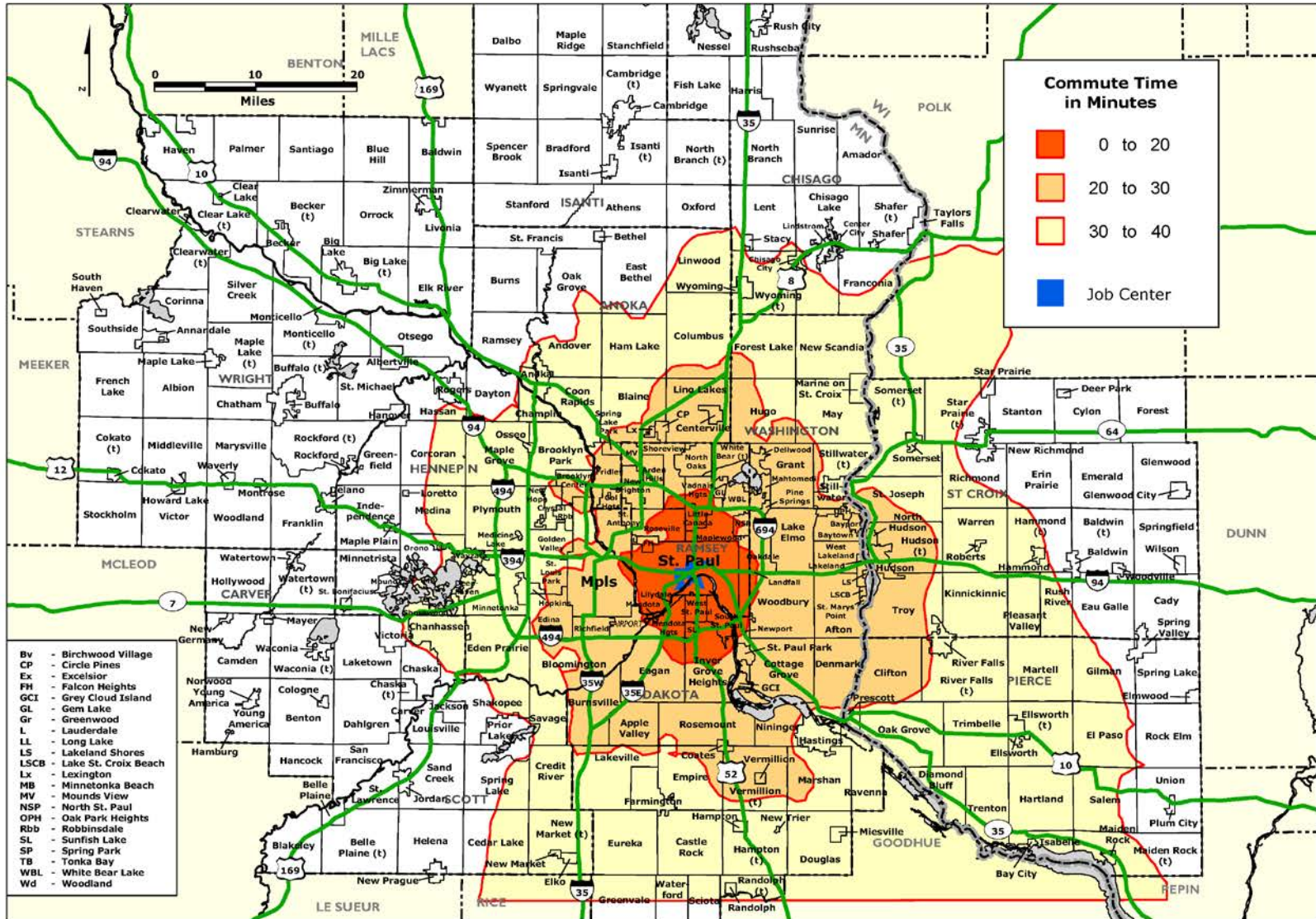

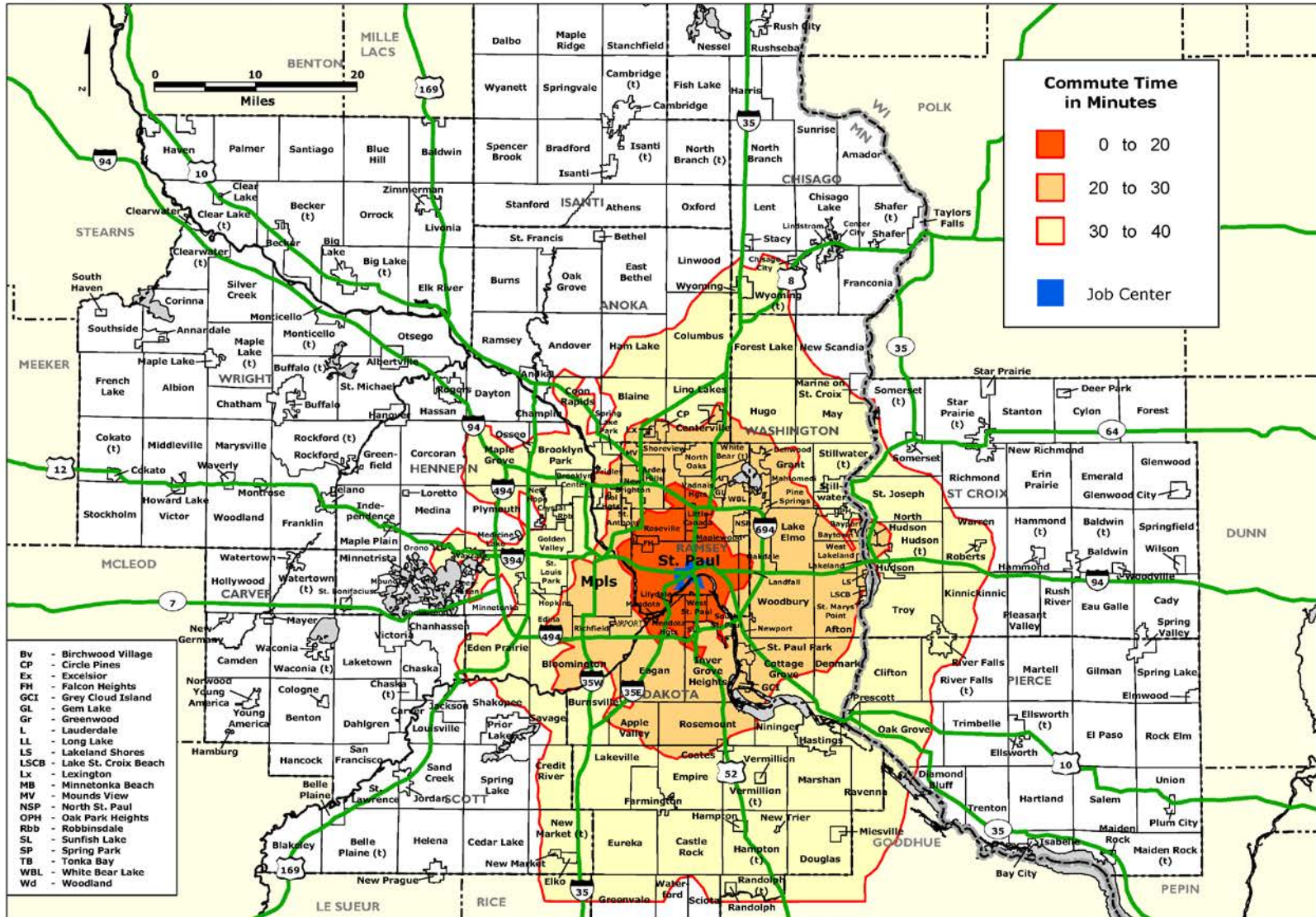

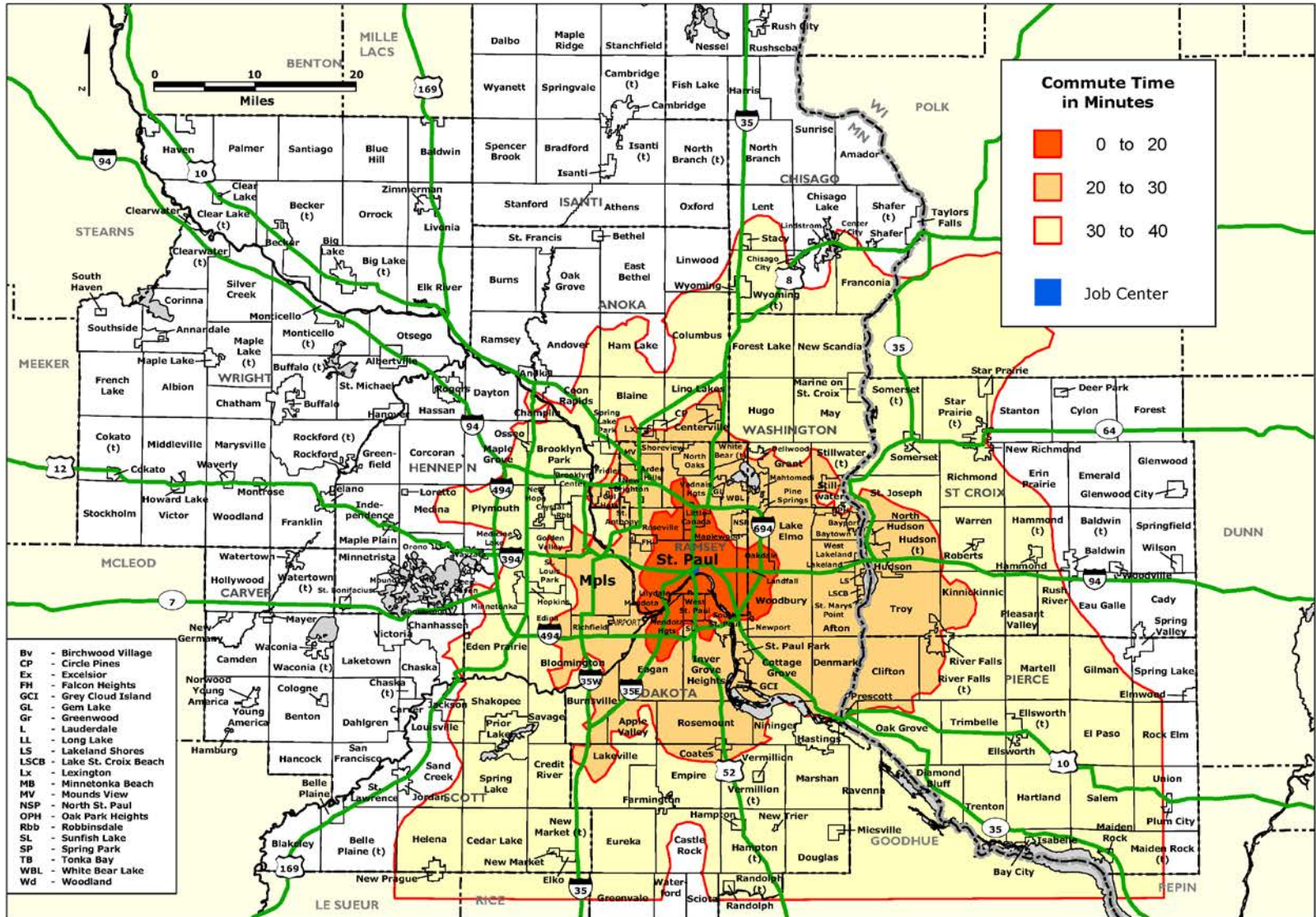

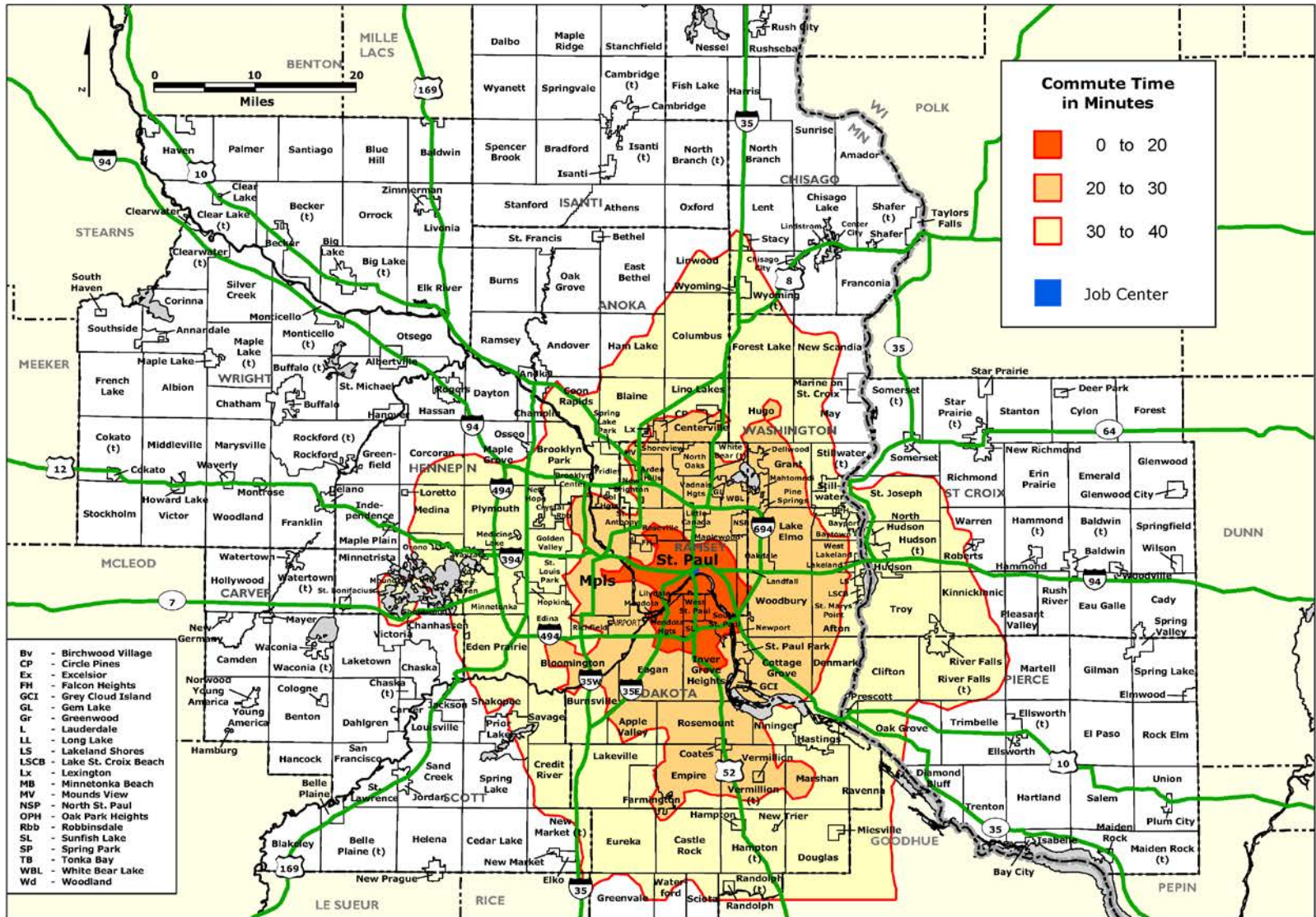
